Implementation of BROADAXE - Special Means -
Week Beginning 13 August 1945.

1. Although satisfaction is generally expressed in official circles upon Russia's entry into the war B. against Japan, it is apparent that this action has not come as a surprise.
2. The entrance of Russia into the war against Japan has been a decided step towards the isolation of the B. Japanese mainland from the Asiatic Continent.
3. An officer who recently returned from Moscow stated at a banquet in Washington that one of the objectives B. of the Russian Army will be to drive south through Manchuria towards Korea.
4. Plans for the invasion of the China coast appear to be going forward, although certain influential Army and Navy circles are strongly agitating for an invasion of Korea in an effort to join up with the Russian forces at the earliest opportunity.
5. An officer on General Somervelle's staff stated off of the record at a recent press conference that Russia B. will occupy Karafuto to serve as a base for the seizure of Hokkaido and that Russia will be assisted in this by American forces stationed in Alaska and the Aleutians.
6. It is believed in official circles in Washington that the Russian's declaration of war against Japan will do much to curb the epidemic of strikes in the United States. However, the coal and transportation problems remain critical.
7. The success of the atom bomb has strengthened the argument of those official quarters arguing for

3. complete encirclement of the Japanese islands prior to invasion. General Arnold was heard to comment unofficially at a luncheon in Washington that he is now convinced that Japan could be bombed into unconditional surrender without an invasion.
4. Although the Philippines and the Ryukus might serve as subsidiary bases for an invasion of Japan, it is not believed that the final assault will be supported from these bases, but that they will probably be intermediate bases and that the principal mounting areas and bases for the invasion will be on the Asiatic mainland itself. Bases in the Mariana and the Carolines, as well as bases in the Aleutians and Alaska, are intended to serve only as bases for operations prior to an assault upon the Japanese mainland. Thereafter, they will become intermediate or supporting bases. Bases in the Admiralty Islands are not being seriously considered in support of major operations.
5. The tonnage delivered over the Stilwell Road during the first six months of this year is more than double that originally anticipated.
6. The Navy favors a landing on Japan in the near future. This view is based upon its conviction that it can establish an invasion force on the Japanese mainland without hindrance from the Japanese navy or the Japanese air force. General Marshall and General MacArthur state that such an invasion is not now possible. They have cited redeployment difficulties, the near breakdown of transportation systems in the United States, and the critical condition of heavy industry as reasons for their conviction. In a case similar, landing on the China coast in furtherance of the grand strategy of encirclement and

blockade of Japan will be undertaken late this summer or early this fall.

11. Although it is stated that the War Department plans to release approximately six thousand high-point men B. experienced railroad men from the Army by the first of October, informed sources believe that such action will be undertaken too late to materially assist in the present crisis and that the backlog, particularly of equipment, has thrown the redeployment program from four to six months behind schedule.
12. The entire transportation crisis in the U.S. has been intensified and made more bitter by a feud between the B. Office of Defense Transportation and the Army, and is currently being investigated by the Senate War Investigating Committee.
13. The U.S. Navy has in the Pacific 83 aircraft carriers, including about 25 of the larger type. The number of B. carriers being constructed is around 35.
14. High staff sources have stated there is no present intention of using the atomic bomb on Chinese territory.
15. The rail traffic situation is being further complicated by the need for good and tight cars for the B. coming harvest season. This will be particularly felt on the trunk lines through the mid-West to the Pacific Coast.
16. Rumors concerning the ending of the war are so rampant in Washington that the temperance unions have been A. seriously agitating for the closing down of all liquor stores throughout the United States for an indefinite period with a view to precluding excess celebration.

This agitation is receiving determined opposition by distillery lobbyists in the capital city.

17. A series of meetings are currently being held in Washington by the Combined Chiefs of Staff with a

A. view to reviewing Allied strategy in the Far East.

However, it is known that present strategy calls for the complete occupation of the Asiatic mainland prior to an invasion of Japan, to prevent the withdrawal of the Japanese Government to the Asiatic mainland for a continuance of the struggle in the event of an invasion.

18. Construction of airfields in Alaska is continuing

A. at an accelerated pace.

19. Part of a group of scientists and engineers, who have been engaged on highly secret work at Aberdeen Proving

A. Grounds, have been flown to Manila. The purpose of their mission is highly guarded. Before leaving Washington, they were engaged in a series of conferences with high ranking staff officers.

20. Four major passenger liners, of more than 100,000 total tonnage that were captured from the Axis, have

A. been assigned to the United States and will be available for the redeployment of troops. The ships are the EURORA, the MILWAUKEE, the VULCANIA and the CARIBIA.

21. The Navy has made a change in the armament of VF's by adding 2 twenty mm cannon. The heavier guns give

A. the Hellcats much more effective firepower against light shipping and permits their increased use against ground troops and installations.

22. The old battleship, WYOMING, is being operated in Chesapeake Bay as a Naval Antiaircraft Gunnery School. About 40,000 officers and men have so far been given antiaircraft training at this school.
23. The Navy will continue research in rocket development in the post-war period. The California Institute of Technology has been conducting experiments for the Navy, operating under the Office of Scientific Research and Development. These activities will be transferred to Naval Ordnance. The Naval Ordnance Test Station in California will continue research and experimental production and will have general supervision of Navy's rocket development activities. The transfer will be effected gradually.
24. The Navy and Coast Guard have released a large number of small boats that have been used to increase the commercial fishing fleet by more than 3,000 boats. This will tremendously increase the fish supply and ease the food situation. Canneries are making preparations for heavily increased operations this fall. Price controls on canned fish have been eased and increased packing facilities have resulted.
25. The Navy has ready for the China coast operations a tremendous new fleet of LCM's. The experience gained A. in the use of mortar ships at Leyte, Lingayen Gulf, Iwo Jima and Okinawa, has speeded the completion of these ships. The mortar groups used in the above-named assaults were converted troop-carrying LCI's. Their effective operation resulted in those specially designed and newly-built mortar ships.
26. Lend-lease supplies are now being shipped to Siberia B. by a northern route.

27. The Russians are known to desire control of either the Perouse or the Tsug-ru Straits as soon as possible, in order to enable more direct shipping from the United States to Russian ports.
28. American air traffic between the United States and USSR is to be routed in the future through Berlin rather than through Tchernan.
29. The opening of additional sea routes to Siberia for the shipment of supplies from the United States is currently receiving careful attention.
30. A new committee called the Committee on New Weapons and Equipment has been established and is charged with facilitating research and development of new materiel. This committee will consider strategic plans and will decide where research should be concentrated.
31. The offer of Danish volunteers to enter the Armed Forces of the United States as they have the British Armed Forces is currently being considered by the Joint Chiefs of Staff. It is not believed that the offer of the Danes in this matter will be accepted because of possible political, administrative and supply complications.
32. Serious concern is felt in well-informed circles that the entire East-West transportation system in the United States may break down under the heavy redeployment load which will shortly be imposed unless a workable solution is soon reached.
33. In addition to being too late to relieve the present transportation crisis in the United States, the removal from Europe and the discharge of trained railroad personnel of Army Forces in Europe has

complicated the movement and redeployment of American forces from Europe to the United States.

34. The Navy has requested a 25% increase in the scheduled
C. production of fleet bombers for the next quarter.
35. Stores in India, that have been built up for Hump operations, will be lend-leased (in part) to SEAC after
C. China landings have been made.
36. A War Department authority states that Patton is now being carefully considered for assignment in the
C. Pacific.
37. Russia's entry into the war against Japan restores her full right to purchases under lend-lease. Negotiations
C. are under way for the purchase by Russia of heavy machinery to restock war damaged plants.

Implementation of BROADAXE - Special Notes -

Week beginning 10 AUGUST 1943..

1. When the two-ocean expansion bill was enacted five years ago the Navy had 283 combatant ships. Since then more than 1300 combatant ships have been built. Allowing for losses of about 140 ships plus transfers of others to allied powers, the United States now has approximately 1500 combatant ships.
2. Troops being redeployed from Marseilles direct to the Pacific are now arriving in the Philippines.
B. Among the engineer and service forces that have already reached Manila are petroleum distribution units, forestry, construction and repair battalions.
3. A convoy is en route to the United States from Great Britain returning the last of the LST's that were operating in the European theater last spring. Any necessary repairs will be made and these LST's will be sent on to the Pacific.
4. A Naval flier, just back from Guam, states that three airfields in the Marianas are used by B-29's and two by fighter planes.
5. Training requiring movement and the movement of troops within the continental limits of the United States has been seriously curtailed by the current railroad transportation crisis. Although the Army announces that it will move in excess of 25,000 troops each month across the United States by converted air transportation, such a movement, even though accomplished, would not effect the transfer of essential material which cannot be shipped by air.

6. The current coal crisis in the United States and the apparent inability of the Potsdam conference
- B. to enunciate a policy covering the solutions of Europe's coal problem is expected to seriously hinder the production of war material, and particularly of steel and heavy armament, in the United States during the coming winter. Although it has been proposed to return German prisoners of war who are experienced coal miners to Germany to work German coal mines in an effort to avert the necessity for shipping coal from the United States to Europe, a well-informed source states that such action will not be undertaken.
7. The liberation of British, French and Dutch Japanese occupied territories will be pursued. The
- B. training of Dutch Marines in the United States continues at an accelerated pace. A French Corps comprised of two divisions and equipped with British equipment is being trained and equipped in Europe. This corps will come under the operational command of the British. The British Chiefs of Staff are requesting the continuance of lend-lease for all British Commonwealth formations, both those engaged in occupation duties and those destined for active combat in the Pacific. The American Chiefs of Staff strongly object to the equipping of any allied formations through lend-lease other than those to be engaged directly in the war with the Japanese.
8. A further build-up of bases in the Aleutians is at present under-
- B. way.

9. British vessels, other than the QUEEN MARY, the QUEEN ELIZABETH, and the AULSTANIA now in service
B. in the Atlantic, are engaged principally in the movement of Canadian troops from Europe to Canada. Even in spite of this, great dissatisfaction on the part of the Canadian government has been expressed over the slow return of Canadian troops from Europe to Canada. It is strongly recommended by the American Chiefs of Staff that the QUEEN MARY, the QUEEN ELIZABETH, and the AULSTANIA be reserved almost exclusively until June of 1946 for the redeployment of American formations from Europe to America.
10. From Chinese sources it is learned that 42 closely guarded copies of a Shanghai Area Coastal Report have arrived in Washington by air from Chungking. This report was dated July 15, 1946. Ten copies were immediately forwarded to CINCPO and ten copies to CINCPAC.
11. A Naval Staff Officer in critically commenting on the labor situation in shipyards stated that a shortage of skilled craftsmen in shipyards was delaying repairs to an extent that could prove serious. He gave as an illustration the time it took to repair the destroyer Ross. He said it took well over 100 days to get this ship ready for action and the time should have been reduced by 30 days. The Ross was struck twice within thirty minutes by mines in the Gulf of Leyte, strafed, bombed and hit by a suicide pilot. This ship has returned to the Pacific Fleet after completing repairs.

12. The Navy has scheduled for completion during the next year 223 major ships, including 3 battleships, 40 carriers, 41 cruisers, 87 destroyers, 16 destroyer escorts part of which are being converted to high speed transports, and 26 submarines.
13. In privately commenting on a statement that appeared in NEWS WEEK of July 30, 1945, that "Top Naval Officers have assigned high priorities to the job of obtaining all possible information on Pacific typhoons", a Navy Staff Officer stated that a system of Pacific weather information now enabled U.S. forces to carry out amphibious operations regardless of the typhoon season. He said that what the Navy had recently done was to establish additional special weather squadrons with weather training as their primary mission. He stated these were patterned after their highly successful Atlantic hurricane warning system and that Pacific typhoons were no longer considered an obstacle to any desirable assault operation and the problem of timing was not of weather but of logistics.
14. The hospital facilities of the Marianas include 4 Army and Navy hospitals that have about 12,000 beds and A. staffed by over 600 medical and dental officers, 6,000 corpsmen and 500 nurses. Guam also has a Naval Medical Research Unit.
15. Although many influential quarters are agitating for a direct assault against the Japanese homeland in view of the apparent impotence of the Japanese Navy and Air Force, the United States Chiefs of Staff feel that an assault now, even if successful, probably would not end the war as the Japanese government undoubtedly has a plan for withdrawal to the Asiatic mainland for a continuance of the struggle.

16. Russia's intentions with respect to declaring war on Japan are still not known even to well-informed circles.
- A. It is felt that should Russia enter the war the primary gain would be the furthering of the encirclement of Japan.
17. The Office of War Information is currently recruiting personnel for China and Korea.
18. In spite of all expedients being undertaken to transport troops to the Pacific, it is presently foreseen that
- B. there will be a backlog of between 250,000 and 300,000 troops by the middle of 1948.
19. The Essex Class airplane carrier USS Hornet has returned to a California shipyard for repairs, according to a high Naval source. This ship had her flight deck damaged in a typhoon east of Okinawa during early June. The Hornet has been one of the most active of the Essex carriers and has engaged in a heavy Pacific campaign.
20. A Congressional authority states that as soon as Congress reconvenes, after a short contemplated recess, the responsible committee will immediately engage in working out an exhaustive plan for post-war reconversion. He said the best opinion felt this program would have to be enacted, or ready for enactment, prior to the general election in November 1946. He said it promises to be one of the busiest periods of Congressional existence since it involved analysis of the economic, social and political future of the United States and that 18 months was a very short time for such a stupendous task.
21. The Navy has developed springs and wells on Guam that will furnish 60 million gallons of water daily. Present daily use is about 15 million gallons on the island, while 30 million gallons are delivered monthly to the fleet.

23. Advanced U.S. Fleet Headquarters in the Pacific requires 15,000,000 gallons of gasoline monthly for air operations. One field uses 700,000 gallons daily. Over 50 miles of pipe lines bring gasoline from tankers and storage.
23. More than 80 per cent of the U.S. bomber and fighter force has been redeployed from Europe. Many of those C. arriving in the United States have already had leave, and are now taking further training preparatory to Pacific duty.
24. No change in basic strategy has been effected by the decisions undertaken at the Potsdam C. conference.
- ✓ 25. It was decided at the Potsdam conference to continue to give all possible aid to China. Landings on the C. China coast are spoken of openly in official circles in Washington.
26. A French corps is now being trained in France and is being equipped with North African and Metropolitan C. Se-aircraft program equipment. This French corps is to be moved from France when it has combat efficiency up to United States standards and has the assurance of sufficient trained personnel. It is not planned that the corps will be available for operations earlier than the fall of 1946, although General MacArthur, under whose command the corps will probably go, has asked that the corps arrive in time to support operations to be undertaken by SEAC. ^{REPLACEMENT}
27. Disappointment has been expressed in high official circles over the lack of any commitment on the part of Russia as to her intentions to enter the war against Japan on the side of the Allies. It is felt that such a declaration of war would offset much of the dissatisfaction generally expressed

over the progress of the war in the Pacific which is now substantially behind schedule and which, it appears, will fall further behind because of redeployment difficulties, the coal and transportation crises, and the strike situation in the United States.

28. Severe security restrictions have been placed upon the movement of civilian personnel to Alaska. Senator ~~W~~hipstad, the United States Senator from Minnesota, is currently making strong representations to the State and War Departments because of a refusal on the part of the War Department to accredit one of his constituents to visit Alaska.
29. A Joint Staff Officer states that the operations of Admiral Falsey's Third Fleet are effectively causing the Japanese to withdraw their Air Forces and ground troops from China landing areas.
30. A Joint Communications Board Officer states that an OVI radio station project in the Aleutians is being held temporarily in abeyance in order to allow for an increase of Okinawa operations from Guam and Okinawa. This has been due to the necessity of controlling movements of refugees in heavily populated sectors.
31. An officer on Vice Admiral Barbey's staff states that minesweeping operations in East China Sea are being speeded up.

Implementation of ECONOMIE - Special News -
Week Beginning 30 July 1945

1. B-24 Liberator Bombers being deployed from Europe to the Pacific are having remote control waist turrets installed in them before passing from the United States to the Pacific Theater.
2. The Army is being criticized in legislative circles for its failure to properly coordinate with defense. Transportation is slowing up redeployment of troops from Europe through the U.S. Railroads are insisting that 75,000 experienced railroad men be immediately released from the Army. An Army Service Forces officer states that this puts the Army on a spot because these men are a vital cog in Army's plan for China and will be among the first to be needed there. An effort is being made to work out a compromise with the domestic situation so that these men will not be lost to the Army but can be called back on short notice.
3. The Higgins shipyard at New Orleans has its assembly line for landing craft again in operation. The labor issues are not yet settled and may flare up at any time. Its Navy contracts are nearing completion but Army contracts of considerable size remain to be performed.
4. War Production Board states that recent heavy demands by Army and Navy for tin have made serious inroads upon the war stock-pile. This will mean further curtailment during the next year in the use of tin for domestic purposes.

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5. A War Production Official stated in a recent closed meeting with Army and Navy staff officers that the reasons they were having so much trouble in meeting production schedules on B-29's was due to strikes; that as soon as they cleared up one, another was underway. He pointed out that only by persistent and strenuous effort and the exercise of high authority had the government succeeded in getting production again started in the rubber plants, and no sooner had that been accomplished than a strike developed at the Wright plant that makes engines for B-29's, and another strike at the Chrysler plant that makes parts for these bombers. He said that in none of these strikes were there any real labor issues involved that seemed to justify strike action.
6. A Naval authority stated that the Naval Amphibious Base at Little Creek, Virginia, has been disestablished and its facilities transferred to other activities.
7. A statement made by General Jacob L. Devers, Chief of Army Ground Forces, has met with mild criticism from sources that desire special consideration in getting certain types of labor released from the army. A high staff officer, in commenting on Devers' statement, said that the combined operations already scheduled would require a U.S. Army of 7,000,000 men, as stated by Devers, and that this figure excludes the forces expected to be furnished by other nations that would be engaged in the fight against Japan. The figure includes no naval forces.
8. The matter of air deployment from Europe to the Pacific is still of great concern to the Combined Chiefs of Staff. The meeting in Potsdam has not rendered any definite decision as to the use of allied air units in the Pacific.

9. Current talk in high military circles has to do with the movement of an airborne brigade to an Alaskan base. This matter is meeting with strong opposition due to the heavy attrition of paratroopers in the European theater of operations.
10. Navy technicians in collaboration with Army technical experts have developed a new radar search receiver A. along with a radar jammer unit.
11. A Navy Staff Officer states that an important conference has been called to meet in San Francisco soon after the first of August. Its purpose is to standardize and coordinate the functions of West Coast Army and Navy shipping information agencies. It will be attended by all interested Army and Navy commands, including representatives of the Chief of Naval Operations, C.I.C. U.S., Coast Guard, Commandant, and Army and Navy agencies from Seattle, Los Angeles and San Francisco. The conference will make a general review of all shipping and distribution problems affecting Pacific Ocean operations.
12. An Army staff officer states that all artillery units being redeployed from Europe will be given intensive new methods training that is particularly designed to destroy enemy discipline during artillery fired from caves and hidden positions. He states that experience gained on Okinawa has developed a new technique that will be effectively employed by U.S. artillery in future actions where such enemy artillery is encountered.
13. Vice Admiral Morell, Chief of the Bureau of Yards and Docks, will soon leave Washington with an inspection party. They will spend forty-five days touring the Pacific and inspecting bases.

14. A Naval source states that the United States Navy has forty aircraft carriers in various stages of construction. This includes three of the large CVD's, nine CV's, two CVL's and twenty-six CVE's.
15. A Naval staff officer states that the aircraft carrier ~~MAINTAIN~~ is in the forces under Admiral Halsey which have been raiding the Empire. This authority states that the ~~MAINTAIN~~ has engaged in more than 25 attacks upon the enemy, all the way from the Gilbert Islands to the Japanese homeland. It has destroyed more than 500 enemy airplanes and has sunk and damaged approximately 1,000,000 tons of Japanese shipping. The ~~MAINTAIN~~ has been hit twice, first in December 1943 by an aerial torpedo and again in November 1944 by a suicide plane. Damage was not serious in either instance.
16. A very high military source states that the meeting between MacArthur and Combatchen decided many matters of national importance. However, one of the important items could not be decided at their meeting and had to be taken up with the Combined Chiefs of Staff meeting in Berlin. This problem concerned the division of boundaries in the Indo China and South China areas. It has been decided that the British Garrison Health Unit i.e. Australians and the New Zealanders will take over the Singapore area.
17. The Army Air Forces have nearly completed their tests on a new P-38 night fighter. This new model has a double cockpit, one for the pilot and one for the radio operator. It has all the performance capabilities of the conventional P-38 plus the night fighting capacity and skill of the P-61, Black Widow.

18. A Navy spokesman has pointed out that it took the
C. Navy over two years to acquire and assemble equip-
ment and materials necessary for the Malaya cam-
paign. A Joint staff officer, having to do with
logistics studies, in privately commenting on the
official spokesman's statement, stated that this did
not begin to tell the story. He said that materials
and supplies had to be diverted to Malaya and that
the replacement of these diversions is now being
effected. He added that other planned operations
greatly overshadow Malaya for size and that they will
not be staged against just one objective. Supplies for
these operations are being assembled, but the logistic
line to the Far Pacific is so long that the job is really
only beginning.
19. A Navy staff officer states that preliminary information
C. indicates it will be several weeks before allied forces
can extract any substantial amount of oil out of Borneo.
He said this means that operations in prospect during
the next year will require increased shipments of oil
across the Pacific with a hope that Borneo will relieve
the situation to some extent when the operations actu-
ally get under way.
20. The release of labor by curtailment of production in
C. the Boeing plant at Seattle has provided a consider-
able number of skilled workers needed there in ship-
yards. However, the labor condition is still critical
and damage to ships is given much local publicity in
order to induce workers to enter the shipyards rather
than going elsewhere seeking more permanent employment.

21. A Naval Intelligence Officer states that the Navy has stocked torpedoes in an amount felt sufficient to meet all demands for the remainder of the war against Japan. For that reason they plan hereafter to produce no torpedoes only. Torpedo production at the Alexandria Naval Torpedo Station has already been cut and it is planned to immediately reduce production at the St. Louis and Forrest Park plants of the American Can Company. He further stated that either or both of these plants are highly suitable to assist in the production of a new naval weapon, and it may be decided to use them for this purpose.
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22. A Congressional authority states that the new Secretary of Agriculture, Anderson, has privately assured members of the House Committee on Agriculture that he firmly believes food rationing can be dispensed with early in 1947. He says that new ration books will be issued in conformity with sound planning to accomplish this result.

Implementation of DORDALS - Special Means -
Week beginning 23 July 1945.

1. The leaders of the Foreign Settlement in Shanghai have forwarded a request to the State Department and War Department that those two Departments decide a safety zone within the Settlement free from hostilities. This request has been refused by the two Departments. It would curtail free movement of troops upon entering Shanghai and adjacent areas. Shanghai is still an important Japanese military center. To make an area free from hostilities would prejudice plans for future military operations.
2. A group of fourteen American scientists and mechanical engineers have gone on a special mission to England to work with British Scientists on a new weapon that is said to be capable of shortening the Japanese war by many months. It is believed that this weapon is designed for deep penetration so as to destroy underground factories and other military installations. The details of this new weapon are not known at this time.
3. A Joint Staff officer states that the present understanding is that the 7th Fleet, that has been operating in Southern waters with MacArthur, will remain under MacArthur's command for the next operation. The recent visit in Washington of Admiral Kinkaid, Commander of the 7th Fleet, and the presence in Washington now of Vice Admiral Earley, Commander of Amphibious Forces of the 7th Fleet, is understood to be in connection with planning for the next operation.

4. An Air Force Staff Officer states that continued bad weather has clouded up air operations in the North Pacific, and most of the scheduled operations had to be cancelled.
5. A Naval officer states that during July and since January last the two thousandth ship, bound for action in the Pacific, passed through the Panama Canal. Although it was not specifically stated by the source, it is believed the majority of these were small landing craft and cargo ships.
6. More than 4,000 planes and 85,000 crew members, according to an Air Force official, have been flown by the Army from Europe to the United States since the first of May. By October the first the Army expects to have returned to the United States from Europe more than 1600 twin-engined planes and 4200 four-engined bombers. elaborate rescue plans have been established, including the use of Coast Guard vessels, along the flying routes. To date only two planes have been lost.
7. The shipyard of the Chicago Bridge & Iron Co., at Seneca, Illinois, has completed the last LST called for in its contract. No further contracts for landing craft are available for this yard since all landing craft that are authorized are already contracted for by other companies. A reliable source states that this yard will be dismantled.
8. In a recent conference held in Washington in which anti-aircraft defenses on the China Coast were discussed, a staff officer of COMUSARP CHINA stated that the anti-aircraft defenses at Nanking are inadequate to prevent a major airborne operation.

- ✓ 9. A high Navy authority states that the United States Navy has on hand about 40,000 landing craft of all types, with more than 15,000 additional authorized and being built.
- ✓ 10. During 1944 the United States produced 98,359 aircraft (including 16,048 heavy bombers), 4,339 ships, 17,685 tanks, 625,330 army trucks, 3,264 heavy field guns and howitzers, 7,454 light field guns, 153,000 army aircraft rocket launchers, 215,177 barbedwires and 1,146,774 tons of ground artillery ammunition.
- ✓ 11. An Army Air Force officer states that a high percentage of the heavy bombers being returned to the United States from Europa will be rebuilt and put in new condition before any of them are sent to the Pacific. Many of them will be used as replacements for training purposes.
- ✓ 12. A War Production official states that during the next few weeks sizeable shipments of heavy equipment and construction materials will be made out of the Pittsburgh, Detroit and Chicago areas destined for Seattle and trans-shipment to the North Pacific.
- ✓ 13. A Naval officer states that the Navy has authorized and will soon award decorations to 28 officers and enlisted men who have served aboard the Essex Class carrier USS Intrepid since it was commissioncd in August 1943. This ship is now back with the Pacific fleet after receiving repairs for battle damage for the fourth time in fifteen months. She is officially credited with destroying 600 enemy aircraft and probable damage to 100 more, and with sinking 75 enemy ships and probably 35 more. Three suicide pilots have

14. The USS GUAM, the new battle cruiser that joined the Pacific Fleet this year, participated in the recent action against Shikoku. This ship first saw battle action last March during the air assault against the Ryukus and the Inland Sea where she supported a withering defense against suicide dive bombers' attack on carrier units. She is reported as most effective in initial assault and in rendering carrier support and has been extensively used in both.
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15. General Spaatz is attending conferences in Washington. While in Washington, he will get his staff more closely knit together and will coordinate with the Navy and Ground forces the future of strategic bombing in the Pacific. While in the United States General Spaatz' assistant, General Clegg, is acting head of USSTAF on tour.
16. Secretary of War, Stimson, is attending the Big Three Conference at Potsdam to make certain that all problems connected with the Japanese war are clearly defined and understood by the British and American heads of state. The position of Russia is not certain at this time.
17. Details on the new XB-36 airplane are not available at present, but will be obtained within the next few days.
18. Secretary of the Navy, Forrestal, has recently returned from an inspection trip on the Pacific Coast. A high Navy authority states that in addition to looking into ship repair problems he made a thorough survey of the loading and embarkation facilities at Seattle.

19. A responsible source states that substantial United States' business interests have approached the Bank of China in New York and discussed the possibilities of transferring funds to China for the purpose of making preliminary arrangements for the establishment of post war trade and business in China. Bank officials are reported to have been in conference with Treasury officials for the purpose of effecting modifications of Treasury Regulations so as to permit transactions of the type business interests desire.
20. A high Chinese official asserts that his Government is interested in regaining the existing extra-territorial rights to the International Settlement in Shanghai that have not been relinquished by Portugal, Denmark, Sweden and Switzerland, once that area is free of the Japanese. It is reliably reported that this question was discussed at the State Department by Chinese representatives who had attended the San Francisco Conference.
21. A new wind tunnel of variable density, capable of testing jet airplanes of more than 700 M.P.H., is being rushed to completion at Buffalo, N.Y. It will test at pressure conditions comparable to an altitude of more than 25,000 feet.
22. A high Navy spokesman asserts that the recent submarine and air operations against Ebikoku have no special significance.

Implementation of BROADBAND - Special Means
Week Beginning 16 July 1948.

1. The Army Air Force's new model of the Mustang Fighter (P-51B) has completed its test runs and is ready for combat service. This newly developed Mustang has a horse-power of over 1600, top speed of over 450 miles per hour, and a range of over 2,000 miles while doing escort duty.
2. General Marshall outlined to the President, before the latter's departure for Berlin, the prospects for an assault on the Japanese homeland. The Chief of Staff pointed out that until Jap military and industrial objectives had been destroyed and the air and sea blockade has been effected an invasion of Japan will not be undertaken.
3. A returning Naval officer states that the British Carriers, H.M.S. Indefatigable and H.M.S. Victorious were hit recently by suicide bombers and are undergoing repairs.
4. Two Infantry divisions stationed in the Southern United States have been issued Arctic clothing.
5. A high ranking Marine officer stated that the Marines' next major operation would not be such a gruelling assignment and their casualties should prove comparatively light since beachheads and ground defenses would not be as tough to handle. He added that this would be true unless it should be decided that it was necessary to go into Formosa ahead of the China Compt operation. Should Formosa prove the first objective, he felt that the lessons learned by the Marines on Iwo Jima and Okinawa would make them more effective and result in a considerably reduced percentage of casualties.

6. A group of civil Censorship officers, most of whom are qualified Chinese linguists, are being assembled in California.
7. Within the last week Vice Admiral Lee has been in conference with Captain Eoyerly, Chief of Staff to Commander of Navy Group China.
8. The Army Air Force have nearly completed their tests on the new jet Propelled Fighter Plane, the P-50. This is a single place fighter with a wing span of approximately 40 feet and a fuselage length of 33 feet. Its weight with maximum fuel load is approximately 14,000 pounds. It has an armament of six .50-caliber machine guns which are supplied with 300 rounds of ammunition each. It is also equipped with one gun camera. Its speed is over 500 miles per hour. It has a range of over 1500 miles. There is talk in Army Air Force circles of a cross-country flight of P-50's to test their running capacity, - when this is to take place is not known.
9. A part of the island of New Britain is being used for a staging area for fresh troops being redeployed from Europe. Already many staff officers from the 1st U.S. Army are in New Britain on reconnaissance missions. Hollandia will also be used as a staging area.
10. A Ground Forces Officer states that since General MacArthur has been placed in command of the forces in China as well as in the Philippines, he is now in a position to mount very quickly the operation against Formosa should that be decided advisable prior to making landings on the China Coast.
11. Over 400,000 officers and men, who have seen duty with the Atlantic Fleet, are receiving intensive training for action in the Pacific.

12. High political and military officials have refused to comment on a recent statement made in
- A. the semi-official London Times in which it commented on British combat policy in the Far East and set forth U.S. strategy as that of being a blockade of the Japanese mainland, and MacArthur crushing land forces in China.
13. The Navy completed during the first six months of 1945 130 LST's of 1,100 tons, 23 LSV(L)'s of 750 tons, 147 LCM's of 450 tons, 31 LCL(L)'s of 277 tons, 4900 LCP's of 8 tons, 440 LCP(L)'s of 6.4 tons, 280 LCF(N)'s of 6.4 tons, and hundreds of various other types of small landing craft ranging up to 20 tons. All are of light displacement.
14. Secretary Stimson having asked for reasons as to the delay in the Pacific war since the completion of the Okinawa campaign, was given the following reasons for this delay: Shortage of troops and material in the Pacific is the main reason. These shortages are due to long supply lines, loss of troops by enemy action on Luzon and Okinawa and the slow process of redeployment, not only the redeployment from Europe but also the release and redeployment of troops in the Pacific who have spent two and three years in that theater of operations.
15. Knowing the effect of strategic bombing as evidenced in Europe, top men in the War Department are making their plans accordingly. One of the main reasons for the extensive use of strategic bombing is the saving of lives on the invasion beachhead. Until a proposed area is thoroughly saturated by bombardment there will be no landing.

16. Political and military figures are holding closed meetings on the treatment of prisoners of war in Japanese camps. Some ex-prisoners have stated that conditions have improved recently, while others say that conditions are as bad if not worse.
17. Air officials have stopped production of the B-17 bomber and have ordered a reduction of 70 percent in the production of air frames for the next year.
18. An Air Force Staff Officer states that the new forces placed under MacArthur's command will be sufficient to enable him to carry on major air operations on different objectives at the same time. The intensity of these attacks would keep the enemy from being able to decide where the next operation would take place. At the same time no effort would be wasted since each air mission would be an assault against enemy strength.
19. On orders of Admiral Nimitz, a Foreign Economic Administration Farming Project has been put in operation in the Marianas. It is under the supervision of expert agriculturists. About 2,000 acres are now under cultivation and more than 3,000 more will be added. Fresh vegetables are already being supplied military hospitals and camps on the islands, and shipments by airplane to Iwo Jima are being made. Increased production will go to meet other service requirements.
20. German prisoners of war are being sent to Alaska as labor battalions.

21. A member of the Senate Foreign Affairs Committee stated that he has found no responsible person in the government who does not agree that Japan must surrender. He says that there is a divided feeling relative to completely crushing Japanese institutions but there is a general determination that Japan must completely surrender her war machine, including her manufacturing establishments capable of producing war materials and weapons, and must reconcile herself to the knowledge that this control will be exercised so long as necessary to prevent a rebuilding of her war machine.

Implementation of BROADAYE - Special Means -

Period 9 to 14 July 1945.

1. A Staff Officer who has just returned from conferences of high ranking commands held in San Francisco
B. stated that bitter feeling was expressed in the conferences regarding labor conditions in U.S. Pacific Coast shipyards. He added that labor's failure to make an all-out effort to repair ships and get them back into combat duty had already delayed the Pacific campaign by six months and, unless measures were taken to at once remedy this condition, the delay would probably be a year.
2. Admiral Jonas Ingram, former Commander in Chief South Atlantic Fleet, is attending conferences in Rio de Janeiro. These conferences are dealing with the proposed use of the Brazilian Armed Forces in the Pacific. He will inspect Brazilian Naval bases and combat and merchant ships while there with the view of appraising what ships can now be used in combat duty as well as transporting men and supplies to the Pacific. He has authority to make tentative offers of replacements and additions of naval units to Brazil effective after the war. He will also ascertain what help, if any, Brazil can give in ship repairing.
3. For morale purposes, the Navy is giving much publicity to cases of extraordinary heroism of individual enlisted men whose citations are won in combat against Japan.
A new destroyer will be named Bazilone in honor of a Marine Corps Gunnery Sergeant who was killed at Iwo Jima after winning the Medal of Honor on Guadalcanal. His wife, who is now in the Marine Corps Women's Reserve, will christen the ship when it is launched next fall.

4. A War Production Board source states that the War Department has placed an order for forty additional locomotives for use in China. Top priorities have been granted.
5. A vehicular mounted mine detector has been perfected which will also detect metallic mines on the road shoulders. The detector sweeps a path approximately 6 foot wide in front of the vehicle or 6 feet to either side.
6. Major General John D. Brooks, former commander of the Newfoundland base, has replaced Major Lavenport Johnson as head of the 11th Air Force in Alcatraz. Special fighter bomber activities in Alcatraz bases are being given special attention.
7. Recent U.S. submarine activity near Japan has resulted in the loss of another U.S. submarine. A reliable Navy source indicated this to be of the San Juan division.
8. A War Production official states that unless the railroads can obtain larger quantities of new rolling stock and rail than has been scheduled for them, they will soon face serious difficulties.
9. More accurate information has been obtained on cargo ships being converted to transports. USA has allocated 100 Victory Ships and 206 Liberty Ships for this purpose. More will follow as re-conversion progresses. Slow progress is being made. Actual work is in progress on less than 50 Liberty Ships and a lesser number of Victory Ships. As program advances, it appears it will provide minimum of 7 converted ships weekly with a desired goal of 15. The converted Liberties will transport about 500 troops each, while Victories will transport about 1600 men. Work is having to be done

10. It is believed that about 15% of the fighter-bomber strength and 20% of the Bombardment Groups of the Ninth Air Force will be returned to the United States immediately. The fighter groups and reconnaissance squadrons will return by ship while the bombardment groups will fly home in Invader attack-bombers.

11. The Ordnance Department of U.S. Army has designed and developed a mud sled to facilitate the transportation of wheeled vehicles such as artillery carriages and trailers over swampy areas, rice paddies, snow, ice and other adverse terrain.
 - A.
12. Unit commanders whose troops are earmarked for the Alaskan Theater are, with their Staffs, meeting in Washington to discuss priorities of equipment and supplies. The training of these units will be supervised by cadres of men formerly with two of the divisions that were in the Alaskan Area and recently withdrawn to the Continental U.S. The Quartermaster has already received an order for Arctic equipment to equip 180,000 men. This is on a very high priority.

13. In the early morning of March 27, 1945, off Okinawa, a Jap dive-bomber crashed on the main deck of the U.S. H.M.A.V.; by noon that day she was back in the firing line. Following this, on April 5, a Japanese coastal battery opened fire on the H.M.A.V., scoring five hits before the ship was maneuvered to return the fire. Less than 100 rounds from the 14-inch main battery were fired in an engagement lasting 10 minutes. The coastal target was destroyed. Damage to the battleship was repaired over night, and she was on the stocks the morning of April 7.

14. At the San Francisco Conference, consideration was given to the logistic requirements for the coming Pacific operations. Decision will have to be made whether to mount the Formosa operation then the Chusan operation or whether they both can be mounted together. The results of the Navy's conference are now being discussed with the Army headquarters in Washington and with General MacArthur in the Philippines.
15. Automobile manufacturers are complaining about the very small number of automobiles for public use the War Production Board has authorized to be built in 1945. Ford Motor Company has started production for civilian use at their Rouge Plant but state that unless they are permitted to build more autos they will soon have to release 40,000 men from employment. If permission should be given to build a larger number, the manufacturer would then have to find and man entirely new sources of engine castings, since regularly programmed production will absorb the total production of presently operating foundries through 1945.
16. General Marshall has privately assured members of the House Appropriations Committee that the appropriations recently passed for the Army's current fiscal year's expenditures will not be the last such big bill required. He said they might expect fully as heavy a bill for next year, and that this year's appropriation would about run out, just when they would really begin to get under way.

17. A high Army source states that, before his recent return to Europe, General Patton was given assurance that he would be given an opportunity to engage in the China Campaign, but it was felt that his return to Europe until he is actually needed in the Pacific was highly important.
18. It is estimated that approximately 600,000 U.S. troops now in Europe will be redeployed through
C. Marseille, France, between now and March 1, 1946.
Most of them will be sent directly to the Pacific. The 66th Infantry Division has been assigned to operate the Marseille staging area.
19. A new rocket launcher made of aluminum alloy, weighing 10 pounds, is being produced by the U.S.
C. Ordnance Department.
20. A big super bomber, B-36, will be dropping the world's largest bombs on the Japanese homeland.
C. These bombs weigh over 40,000 pounds. They are designed along the lines of the "Tall Boy" bombs in order to achieve maximum velocity and earth penetration. Approximately 40% of the bomb's weight is in its explosive charge.

Implementation of Continuation of Bluebird -
Special Hours - Period 2 to 7 July 1945.

1. It is learned from high authority that on the occasion of the eighth anniversary of China's war against Japan, Admiral King will issue a statement to the Chinese people through the Central Daily News of Chungking, congratulating them on their valor and determination and pointing out that their manpower and geographic location will be determining factors in the program to defeat Japan.
2. A high political source states that when President Truman visited San Francisco, and while there invited Admiral Nimitz to his hotel, that Nimitz took occasion to impress upon the President three points he considered of the utmost importance:
 - a. Production and delivery to the Pacific Theater as soon as possible of large numbers of landing craft and small boats.
 - b. Speeding up the conversion of merchant vessels into transports.
 - c. The all-out efforts of shipyards to hasten the repair of combat ships so they could be returned to combat duty with the least possible delay.
3. In privately discussing reports that Japan was preparing numerous suicide weapons for use in the event of an invasion of the homeland, a Staff Officer stated that Japan might never have the opportunity to use any such weapons, as there was more than even chance that once the U.S. had completed their circle of bases that there were some surprises in the form of new weapons in store for Japan. He stated this could easily result in Japan asking the U.S. to walk into the mainland without fighting their way in.

4. The railroads of the United States will be subjected to their greatest strain of the war during 1945, according to high authority in the Army Service Forces. He says that plans for redeployment call for the moving of 1,600,000 men across the country during a single month in 1946. This far exceeds the 1,100,000 moved across during August 1943 when railway equipment was in at least 25% better condition than it is today.
5. Vice Admiral Joe, Commander of Battleships, Pacific Fleet, is in Washington and dined with the Secretary of Navy. More details later.
6. A high Navy source states that the Bonin Islands will not be by-passed, as they not only constitute a considerable annoyance to Naval and Air operations but also form an important spot in connection with plans projected for some time in the future.
7. A Maritime Commission official states that work stoppages are causing delays in obtaining refrigerating equipment necessary for the reconversion of cargo ships to transports. The Commission is also finding difficulty in recruiting qualified cooks and mess help.
8. USS COUNTIES AV-4 was hit by suiciders about May 20 and had nearly one hundred casualties. Fuel tanks and magazines forward were badly damaged and major Navy Yard repairs will be required.
9. Rear Admiral Gardner, former commander of a task group in Task Force 50, has relieved Admiral Duncan as the Navy Chief of Planning in the Navy Department.

10. A member of General LeMond staff, attending conferences in Washington, stated that supplies are not reaching Alaska as quickly as desired. He added that this delay was undoubtedly due to the redeployment program, which at present is using all available shipping. This statement, which was made at a joint meeting of Army and Navy officials, was concurred in by a high Navy official who added that the Navy was having its difficulties also. The difficulties are, mainly, the maintenance of the 9th Fleet.
11. A high naval source states that Capt. W.G. Greenman, Director of Naval Petroleum Reserve, has recently sent an officer to the Southwest Pacific for the purpose of personally surveying the present condition of the Borneo oilfields. This officer had just returned from Alaska where he had been inspecting Naval oil operations.
12. A War Department source states that several weeks ago the Army Ordnance Department established a new unit at Aberdeen Proving Grounds, Maryland, and that they have obtained as a loan from several leading manufacturers the use of several of their outstanding engineers, chemists and scientists. These men have been engaged in the development of some new weapon for use with aircraft. It was further stated that the results of their work would prove astounding.
13. CV 42 LEXINGTON was seriously damaged by a suicide plane attack about the middle of May during the Okinawa campaign.

14. High Navy authority states that the Navy is seriously concerned over the strike situation, particularly at the Goodyear plant in Akron, Ohio, where 17,000 rubber workers have just voted to continue their strike. Unless this strike is settled immediately, it will probably result in the stoppage of airplane assembly lines due to a shortage of rubber tires and fuel tanks.
15. Scarcity of meat in the U.S. is causing mounting dissatisfaction. In the Detroit area, workers have gone on strike in protest against their failure to obtain meat for luncheon in company lunch room. Price control has cut the Army allowance by 25%. Quartermaster officers state this disrupts their schedules and causes a change in the plans for feeding the Army. This reduction will be absorbed as much as possible among troops being redeployed so as to permit gradual changes in feeding overseas troops.
16. Rear Admiral Sherman, Chief Planner for Admiral Einitz, has returned to the Pacific after attending conferences in Washington.
17. A very reliable source states that an auxiliary airfield is being built at Point Spenser, Alaska. This field will be fog free thereby making it available for B-29's now going into that area.

1. An informed source states the underlying reasons for the recent changes in Army's Pacific Supply Commands, whereby Major General Groninger was transferred from New York to the command of the San Francisco Port of Embarkation, and MacArthur's abolishment of his Service of Supply Command and creating a new command under Lt. General Styer to have sole responsibility for maintaining the supply flow of ammunition, equipment, food and personnel are:

Germany's collapse came so much more suddenly than anticipated as to find the Army supply organization unprepared to handle quickly the increased volume of men and supplies available for the Pacific. Those in supply command were given the chance to get things rolling, but matters went from bad to worse. MacArthur and Marshall regretted the delay; a re-organization would cause but felt it the surest and quickest way to get results.

2. Rear Admiral F. P. Sherman, Deputy Chief of Staff, Plans Division, CINCPAC and SEAC has been attending Joint Staff conferences in Washington.
3. The AF Deputy Chief for Plans states that B-29's will begin operating from bases in Okinawa early in July.
4. Daily shipments from India to China via AFHQ are increasing beyond expectations.
5. High level War Department informant states that MacArthur recently inquired of the Chief of Staff if Patton's return to Europe meant he was unavailable for action in the Pacific, that he felt Patton's knowledge, experience and command tactics would make him of inestimable value in heading an Army in China. Consideration is being given to assigning Patton to command of an Army, other than the Third, in the Pacific. However, it is also felt that Patton's ability is so recognized in Europe that his very presence in command there affords considerable insurance against trouble during the period of American occupation.
6. Naval officials say the new Grumman "Tigercat", F7F, is "the most powerful fighter-bomber yet produced for the Navy". It is powered by two 2100 hp P & W engines and can climb a mile a minute. It has a speed of about 425 mph. It can carry two 2-ton bombs or a full size marine torpedo. A two-place night-fighter model is being made.
7. High Navy source states that Army and Navy officials are making strenuous efforts to settle labor difficulties in Higgins shipyard at New Orleans. Tie-ups are causing expensive delays in the production and delivery to MacArthur of small boats and landing craft. The Maritime Commission has been ordered to use all available means to speed the conversion of cargo boats to transports.
8. U.S. aircraft production for May 1945 slightly exceeded schedule. A total of 5,534 of all types of aircraft were produced during May.
9. President Truman's visit to Governor Wallgren was not solely for recreation and rest. A War Production Board official states that labor conditions in Pacific Coast shipyards prompted this detour by the President, and that he held private conferences with labor leaders and shipyard officials. There is considerable labor unrest in the Admirelty Cities, due to

Kaiser's conversion to private operation upon cessation of his government cost-plus contracts. Organized labor is resentfully fighting his proposed changes in labor policy and is also concerned about permanent employment. This threatens a serious disruption of ship construction and repair activities. It not only affects Kaiser, but is spreading to other yards.

10. Navy's personnel now exceeds 3,300,000, ten times the pre-Pearl Harbor figure. New construction and conversions have increased Navy tonnage by 15,000,000 tons since Pearl Harbor.

11. Vice Admiral Kletscher is vacationing in the Northwestern U.S., and is expected to return to Washington for conferences regarding his future assignment.

High Navy source states that there is a feeling among Staff officers he should be kept on the Staff in Washington since new air bases built towards the eventual encirclement of Japan are changing the combat perspectives of carrier task forces. Kletscher was requested to think the situation over as no decision would be made pending his return to Washington.

12. USS PENNSYLVANIA has had new 14-inch guns put in all her main batteries.

16 June to 22 June 1945,

1. The German situation has resulted in the decision to keep stronger and more experienced forces in the Army of occupation, leaving the Third Army in Germany as one of the results. This has necessitated sudden and abrupt changes in redeployment plans. Patton is reported as being desirous of leading the Third Army in Japan but will not be adverse to heading a new army. Plans are under way for redeployment of the Ninth Army and Patton is mentioned in its connection.
2. More than 300 cargo ships are being converted into transports, and the Maritime Commission is also reconverting 100 Victory Ships to transports. These will carry on long hauls a minimum of 500 men plus the crew.
3. War Production authority states reconversion announcement has caused skilled labor to leave war work seeking steady employment. This has caused disruption in many war plants and the War Manpower Commission may have to freeze skilled labor to the war jobs.
4. The submarine TRIGGER is reported by high authority as having failed to return from patrol in Japanese waters.
5. Gen. MacArthur's Headquarters have been requested to forward to Washington all information as to present condition of Borneo oilfields.
6. High-ranking air officers are reported as having great confidence in the performance of the A-26, and believe it will prove one of the greatest weapons against Japan.
7. Fighter pilots are being trained in California on the P-20. Delay in their combat use is expected due to engine production and pilot training.
8. About 20 Bombardment Groups have been released by ETO for Pacific duty.
9. The War Production Board has eased some of the restrictions against the use of aluminum for public needs.
10. The USS BUNKER HILL, Essex class carrier, was struck twice in thirty seconds by suicide planes, after weathering 58 days of campaigning off Iwo Jima, Tokio, Inland Sea, Kyushu and Okinawa. She was hit 11 May 1945. There were heavy casualties and severe damage was suffered. Vice Admiral Mitscher was using the BUNKER HILL as his flagship at the time. This ship has put in to Puget Sound Navy Yard for repairs.
11. A responsible source says the State Department is pleased over the Russian situation and that Hopkin's report was definitely encouraging. They believe that certain vexing questions will be cleared up at an early meeting of the Big Three.
12. General Stilwell has warned that, "We still have to fight a long war against the Japs in Manchuria and China."
13. The USS PENNSYLVANIA was recently regunned with 12 14-inch guns reclaimed from Pearl Harbor. Regunning was accomplished in record-breaking time.

14. Navy Patrol Bombing Squadrons numbers 103, 105, 107, 110 and 112 have returned to the United States for redeployment. They have been flying Liberators and operating under the Coastal Command of the RAF. After leave in the U.S., some or all of them will receive training on the Navy's new twin-engine Corsair.

9 June to 15 June 1945
inclusive

1. Hoping up in the Philippines will be turned over to the Filipino Army, thus relieving U.S. forces for operations in China.
2. A large new airfield has been opened on Guam for use of B-29's.
3. The Japanese retreat from Indo-China is playing into American hands. This leaves Jap forces in Thailand and adjoining areas cut off from main body of Jap troops.
4. Using B-29 equipment, General Doolittle will command the 20th Bomber Command.
5. The 27,000 ton aircraft carrier LAKE CHAMPLAIN was commissioned on 3 June 1945. Will take shakedown cruise about last of June or first of July. Captain Logan Ramsey will be in command.
6. Vice Admiral Mitscher has been in Washington for conferences. He says suicide attacks are "not too serious" and believes their effectiveness can be practically eliminated. He is reported to have visited an airplane engine plant and the Alexandria Naval Torpedo Station.
7. Backlog of orders at Ryan Aeronautical Company amounts to \$116,000,000. There have been no labor lay-offs and 2000 additional workers are needed this year.
8. Wright Aeronautical has developed a new turbosupercharger for installation on war planes and transports. It is more compact and adaptable than any heretofore used.
9. The Army is releasing certain enlisted men who have served in the Pacific for more than three years. Some of them are offered the opportunity to go to China to aid in training Chinese troops.
10. The Supply organization of the Western Sea Frontier has been nearly perfected. Emphasis is now shifting to advanced bases and steps being taken to build up proper supply in the Marianas, the Philippines and, later on, Okinawa. Official circles believe redeployment from Europe to the Pacific can be accomplished more rapidly than European build-ups, and expect drives against Japanese strong points can begin in not much more than one year's time.
11. Five heavy bomber groups of the 15th Air Force have left Italy for training in U.S. on B-32's before going to the Pacific.
12. General Stilwell, after conferences in Washington, left for the Philippines where he will talk with MacArthur regarding plans for continuing war in China.
13. General Vandegrift says the Marine Corps will not be demobilized in any respect at this time. Their combat experience will be put to full use in Pacific operations.
14. United Aircraft plants have new developments under way as follows: a 3000 h.p. radial air-cooled engine; a gas turbine engine and a

jet propulsion engine; a propeller for gas turbine engines; and a jet fighter plane for the Navy.

15. The HI-2 is a transport version of the Navy's P24-T-2 patrol bomber. It has a range of over 3000 miles and a speed of over 250 m.p.h. It will carry 26 passengers and a crew of four.
16. The transport YANCOVICH was launched 5 June 1945 at Bethlehem-Hingham shipyard, Inc. This was the last of the ships contracted to be built by this firm. They have operated for 37 months and have built 75 destroyer escorts, 95 tank landing ships, 40 infantry craft and 17 high speed transports.
17. A pneumatic bomb-bay door is a late devise on the B-29's. Doors now open in less than one second, and close in from two to three seconds. A 10-lb. electrically-driven air compressor provides the operating energy.
18. Continental Aviation and Engineering have announced a new 12 cylinder, 60° inverted V-type liquid cooled engine, designated I-1430. It features compactness and reduced weight, and develops 2100 h.p. at 3400 r.p.m.
19. The Mars Task Force, having flown from Burma to China, is waiting movement orders. It is comprised of Merrill Marauders, 124th Cavalry Regiment and the 475th Infantry Regiment.
20. Fierce resistance on Okinawa has delayed plans for the use of this island for mounting further operations, possibly against the China Coast.
21. There will soon be ready for use a new heavy-weight glider known as the XCG-17. These are C-47 planes without engines.
22. The destroyer ZELLARS, that was hit off Okinawa by a suicide bombing plane, reached a U.S. naval operating base on the Pacific Coast the latter part of May.
23. Alexandria Naval Torpedo Station is now manufacturing 5 inch rockets, and part of the plant is being revised to make gun parts, gun mount sub-assemblies, aircraft armament, mine parts and miscellaneous parts for Army and Navy use.
24. Army Air Technical Service Command have succeeded in making the whole fuselage of air planes, and wing sections, from an impregnated glass cloth. They claim this surpasses wood and metal in durability, eliminates rivets and gives a perfectly smooth finish. The process is said to be so rapid that it may replace time-consuming methods now used in plane manufacture.
25. The destroyer STRIBLING has been launched at Mariners Harbor, New York.

No. 10
2 June to 8 June 1945, inclusive.

1. Allied Forces in China took advantage of the delays caused by heavy fighting on Iwo Jima and Okinawa to improve their position. General Wedemeyer has reported he is about ready to take the offensive.. This has afforded planning groups the difficult task of arranging coordination of Wedemeyer's offensive with assaults against the China Coast. New plans will soon be forwarded to theater commanders.
2. The Willow Run plant, slated to be closed 30 June, will be kept in stand-by condition and an effort made to keep labor available for any resumption of work by employing released laborers locally. Bomber production is ahead of current needs until new Pacific air bases can be established.
3. A new low-tension high frequency set has been developed by General Motors that facilitates the starting of aircraft motors in sub-zero weather.
4. An experimental Army fighter recently fell at Dayton, Ohio, killing the pilot.
5. Supply personnel on Okinawa are handling as much tonnage per month as those at the Port of Honolulu. More than 200,000 gallons of aviation gas and motor gas and 32,000 gallons of Diesel oil is delivered to Okinawa each day.
6. The complete Chinese 6th Army has been moved to China from Burma by the U.S.A.F.C.
7. Army's own "Terry" has been increased by the development of a new ocean-going steel tug that will be used for long distance heavy towing and salvage work.
8. It has been now learned that the U.S. minesweepers turned over under Lend-Lease to the Russians in New York, and that sailed from New York Harbor on 22 May 1945, were routed via St. Johns, N.B.
9. The CVE, Cape Gloucester, has sailed from San Diego to join the fleet in the Pacific.
10. Repairs on the carrier Franklin are being rushed. Photos and drawings were flown to the U.S. while the ship was en route so that parts and materials could be ready when it arrived. This ship was once reported sunk in sight of the coast of Japan. Much publicity is being given re its ability to return under its own power.
11. Three Liberty Ships loaded with ordnance material sailed from Leghorn, Italy, about 21 May, for a Pacific base.
12. Considerable critical comment has been made in the U.S. about the British and French charging the U.S. high toll rates for redeployment shipping going through Suez.
13. A "night fighter panel" made of high precision laminated plateglass and bullet resistant is used as a gun-sight reflector on Navy Corsair fighters.

14. Rear Admiral Colbert, Director of the U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey, has submitted to the Navy Department a detailed study of completed data on tides, currents, and other geographical aspects of the China Coast.
15. A laboratory for the study of lubricants and fuels for jet propulsion has been built and is operating at Wood River, Illinois.
15. Army and Navy commands plan to make effective the agreement reached at San Francisco by the Big Five that the U.S. should exercise sovereignty over the Pacific islands it takes by arms, including Okinawa. Materials for extensive air bases are en route to Okinawa. Construction of facilities to accommodate large land forces will follow the completion of air bases. It is predicted in official circles that U.S. forces will never leave Okinawa.
17. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers have developed a new cableway designed to transport supplies, ammunition, anti-tank weapons and mobile equipment across unfordable streams.

No. 9
26 May to 1 June 1945, inclusive.

1. The Navy is planning a post-war force of about 500,000 men and 50,000 officers in connection with proposed program for universal training. Post-war fleet will be about 70% of its present operational strength. Heavy ship construction will be completed in 1947.
2. Members of resistance forces in Western Netherlands will be asked to enlist for campaign in Netherland Indies and Netherland Marines would be trained in U.S. Norwegian Merchant Marine will assist Allies in Pacific war.
3. New rocket factories are being constructed at a cost of \$100,000,000.
4. Army and Marine Corps are being equipped with a new carbine - the M-2. It has an automatic fire rate of 750 rounds a minute.
5. Army hospitals in U.S. are now caring for nearly 300,000 patients. Sick and wounded are being returned to the U.S. at a rate of about 45,000 per month.
6. High Navy officials requested additional details concerning the sinking of five Japanese vessels off the coast of Formosa by one PBM-Mariner.
7. Lend-Lease shipments to Russia during first quarter of 1945 amounted to \$662,000,000. Of this \$258,000,000 was in war equipment. President Truman says existing agreement will be performed.
8. The 27,100 ton aircraft carrier Tarawa is being rushed to completion at the Norfolk Navy Yard. It is 886 feet long and 93 feet wide, has a crew of 2500 officers and men, carries more than 80 planes and speed exceeds 30 knots. Armament 5 inch guns and .20 and .40 mm weapons.
9. Atlantic Air Force, under command of Vice Admiral Bellinger, has been or is on its way to the Far East.
10. The Army and Navy have released a statement relative to the Japanese paper balloons that have been occasionally falling in the Western Hemisphere. Warning is given to vacationists and inexperienced not to risk handling them. U.S. meteorologists said to have obtained from them the answers to some of their own experiments.
11. Navy has requested additional carriers to prosecute Pacific war and is employing new workers to speed their completion.
12. General Electric has developed for use on B-29's and P-61's an automatic gun charger designed to prevent the failure of aerial machine guns due to defective ammunition.
13. Intelligence agencies are compiling information on alleged Japanese atrocities as well as detailed information on the Imperial Rule Assistance Association for purpose of placing proper Japanese officials on War Criminals List.
14. Westinghouse Electric Corporation has had an \$11,000,000 reduction in its war contracts during first two weeks of May. They have unfilled orders of approximately half a billion dollars.
15. New aircraft carrier Kearsarge of the Essex class is expected to be delivered in record time.

16. Official circles are closely watching the Japanese movements in the vicinity of Foochow.
17. U.S. soldiers returning from the Pacific say that the inability of the American soldier to read and interpret Jap signs often results in unnecessary loss of life.
18. During April 1945, 5900 planes of all types were manufactured. This was 1 $\frac{1}{3}$ above scheduled output and included 330 very heavy bombers, 675 heavy bombers, and 640 two-engine bombers, and 2350 fighters.
19. A new featherweight bazooka is now in production for the Army.
20. U.S. authorities have agreed to construct 14 merchant vessels of 7800 tons each for Brazil, to be built within a year and paid for outside of Lend-Lease.
21. Equipment, material and supplies in large quantities for the building of air bases are in transit from U.S. factories to the Central Pacific. Much of this has already left San Francisco.

No. 8
19 May to 25 May 1945, inclusive.

1. American First Army under General Hodges is on the move and will see action against Japan after troops receive furlough in U.S.
2. French Foreign Minister Bidault has announced here that General De Gaulle will meet President Truman at future time upon express request of Truman.
3. Tension here over Trieste situation has eased following withdrawal of Tito forces from Corinthia and Styria.
4. U.S. Navy has requested additional carriers to prosecute Pacific War and is employing new workers to speed completion of large fleet carriers under construction.
5. U.S.S. Webbenta Bay has left San Diego after extensive repairs to flight deck.
6. Recent conference by top ranking officers from all Pacific areas discussed among other things relative to next major operation against Japan:
 - a. Extent of Chinese participation,
 - b. Extent of British, French, Dutch and Australian participation, and
 - c. Part to be played by air attacks and from what bases.
7. General Stilwell inspected new General Pershing tank and gave it his warm approval.
8. Labor recruitment in Philadelphia area being sent to Philadelphia Navy Yard to help complete carriers Valley Forge and Princeton.
9. A 28-hour, six-minute, record-breaking flight by new Mariner PB4Y-5, which is now in production by Martin.
10. New type of automatic welding is manufactured by Lincoln Electric Welding Co.
11. Air Transport Command will employ several hundred transport planes to assist in redeploying troops from France.
12. Navy has authorized a program permitting discharge of enlisted men over 42 years of age or where there are limited physical conditions.
13. Alexandria Naval Torpedo Station manufacturing rockets and other vital ordnance weapons.
14. Pacific bases to accommodate redeployment of troops from France, particularly air forces, are a delaying factor.
15. Newly organized army known as the 6th Army has recently completed training and now ready for battle completely equipped with American equipment. Thought they will be used in a drive to China Coast to join with expected American landings.
16. Informed source states one major overall policy of Army and Navy commanders calls for prevention of reinforcement of Japanese forces in China by effecting a close submarine, surface and air blockade around

1. U.S. will use new 15th Army and parts of 8th and 9th Air Forces for occupation forces. Post war control plans tentatively allot to U.S., Southwest Germany, including Bavaria and part of Austria, the area east of the Elbe to Russia, and the remainder to Britain. U.S. Will use not more than 400,000 men.
2. Opinion here that World Security Conference in danger over Polish situation.
3. Much speculation here as to whether Russia will fight Japan. Official information not available. The decision will be Russia's. Some say China not anxious for Russia to get in. Withdrawal from Europe of major U.S. forces causes some alarm in view of free hand left to Russia in Europe.
4. Little possibility of U.S. and Britain accepting as a permanent government for Germany the government proposed by Russia for its zone of occupation. U.S. and Britain were not consulted by Russia in newly formed governments in Czechoslovakia and Austria.
5. Molotov claims unanimity at San Francisco; however questions far from settlement seem to be Polish recognition, trusteeships and revision of presently existing treaties of alliance.
6. Informed sources now consider Russia most powerful nation in Europe. Damage to Southeastern Russia's center of heavy industry offset to some extent by development in Urals. Fair crop expected this year.
7. Arrest of London Polish leaders attracting much attention. U.S. and Britain have demanded Stalin fully explain. Molotov evades question.
8. Russia said to be pressing demands for favored treatment re Dardanelles, occupation of Formosa and Manchuria and protectorate over Korea. Russia intoxicated with victory and time has come for policy of hard bargaining with Soviet.
9. Informed source place Russian civilian and military losses as including 12,000,000 to 15,000,000 dead.
10. U.S. Army will be reduced from 8 million to 6 3/4 million by discharging troops who have extensive overseas service. Over half of troops presently in Europe will be sent to Pacific via U.S. Others will go directly after receiving battle training in Europe.
11. Molotov said to have demonstrated Russia's interest in World Security Organization only because she recognizes U.S. power. High officials fast learning Russia is influenced only by a show of power and not words.
12. It is stated that U.S., Britain, and Russia, with agreement by France, have consented to a system of international control of Ruhr and Saar areas on a permanent basis.
13. Lend-lease aid to Russia ended legally on cessation of fighting in Germany. Believed Truman will waive legal point and continue aid.

14. Equipment and supplies from Europe are moving to the Pacific via the Panama Canal. Some troops have already left the Mediterranean area via Suez Canal.
15. Conferences are being attended in Washington by Vice Admiral Kinkaid.
16. The Tenth Fleet is being shifted to Pacific areas.
17. Manufacturers of landing craft are speeding up their output.
18. To relieve dock congestion at Pacific ports as well as delay on railway equipment, transcontinental freight of certain priorities, like wool, from the Pacific to the Eastern seaboard is being diverted from the railroads to water transportation.
19. Shoulder patches of the 157th and 93rd Divisions have been seen on troops on furlough in the U.S.
20. The new B-32 bomber will soon be in operation. Has a top speed of 382 m.p.h. at 32,000 feet, normal cruising speed of 316 m.p.h., range 2900 miles, bomb load 20,000 lbs., armament ten .50 caliber machine guns; crew, 10 men. Pilots returning from Europe are now receiving training on it and expect to soon be furnished with them.
21. The 8th Air Force is being redeployed from England. Some direct to the Pacific and others via the U.S.

5 May to 11 May 1945, inclusive.

1. Welding equipment procured for the use of the USA Corps of Engineers does not operate on high frequency alternating current but on direct current.
2. A gyro stabilizer developed by Westinghouse has been incorporated on U.S. light and medium tanks for some time. A thicker armor protection has been provided the M26 than that of medium or light tanks. Development of modifications of the M26 are under way providing thicker armor than the standard M26. Modifications have also been made on some of the M4's providing thicker frontal armor. These are designated M4A3E2 and have been in use during the past year.
3. Statements in American newspapers say that Truman and Churchill fully believe that Hitler and Goebels are dead. Also reported that Goering and Himmler have disappeared without a trace. Russian reports show no positive belief in the death of Hitler and Goebels and indicate they consider this German propaganda for furthering of underground movement. American public opinion on the death of Hitler appears divided.
4. Sikorsky's Stratford plant manufactures Pratt and Whitney engines, Hamilton propellers, Chance Vought airplanes, Sikorsky helicopters. The plant covers an area of 5 square miles and employs 30,000 people. There are 5 main buildings, 4 wind tunnels and a test field of approximately 500 acres. Sikorsky does not have a rocket propelled cargo plane in the drawing stage.
5. Renovation of camps in Southern States is under way for use of troops returning from overseas.
6. General Arnold, Chief of Army Air Forces, is in Brazil. He is due to retire soon. Also returning to the U.S. at an early date is Lt. Gen. Vandenberg, commanding the 9th Air Force in Europe. When Arnold retires he will likely be replaced by Lt. Gen. Eaker, present Chief of Staff to Arnold, and Vandenberg will likely move up to Eaker's place.
7. Early victory in the Philippines certain, the end of the European war in sight and Okinawa progressing as expected, U.S. Chiefs of Staff are said to feel that they will soon be in the strongest possible position to continue their westward advance and probably with early attacks on Formosa and the South China Coast.
8. Commander of Navy Group in China, who completed his Washington conferences and proceeded to the Pacific, has now concluded a series of conferences in the Pacific and will be back in China very soon.
9. The "Franklin D. Roosevelt," recently launched CVB, is 937 feet long and about 108 feet wide.
10. Top ranking officers from all Pacific Army and Navy Commands have been holding conferences in Washington on logistics.
11. Temporary quarters have been furnished Russian officers and enlisted men at Navy Frontier Base, Long Island. They are sent from there to various training activities and some are taking delivery of ships in New York Harbor. Under lend lease twelve YMS mine sweepers are being

turned over to the Russians and are being sailed to the Baltic and Black Seas where they will be used at first to clear mined areas and then serve as coasters (freighters) to aid in relieving transportation problems in those areas.

12. Strategic air forces in Europe are now being released and transferred. 15th Air Force is returning to the U.S. Training on the A-26 is being given many of the pilots. After training they will be rushed to Pacific Theater for concentrated strikes against Formosa and the South China Coast. Only a minimum number of strategic air force personnel will be left in Europe.

No. 5

29 April to 4 May 1945, inclusive.

1. An officer in ASF stated that he had dinner with friends whose son is in the 491st Infantry, and the son had written that he had come back from overseas to find himself engaged in the most boring work of his entire Army service, that he is now engaged in close order drill and other basic training.
2. Reports from a friend in San Francisco states is not quite so busy now because shipment has been held up on some construction material and other follow-up supplies intended for a main Pacific operation.
3. Return of Marshal Petaim and publicity here re atrocities unusual. High government officials urged Congress to pass law to enable use of arms and ignore treaties in order to pursue war criminals.
4. Atrocity stories have stirred up people and affected soldiers available for discharge so as to request return to active combat duty.
5. Black Widow, P-61 has retractable ailerons making possible extending of landing flaps nearly whole length of wing. Has new Goodrich devices. Four 20mm cannon and four .50 machine guns. Fitted with radar when used as a night fighter.
6.
 - a. Apparatus used for bombing through clouds involves use of radar. Outline of target appears on screen which is a cathode ray tube. Can outline buildings, water, etc. May be used as aid to navigation.
 - b. Aircraft when flying overseas to be supplied with apparatus to convert sea water into drinkable water.
 - c. Bell Airacomet, P-59A has jet propulsion engines built by General Electric. They are great improvement over English design. Can use low-grade kerosene. Top speed about 570 m.p.h. Used only as trainers.
7.
 - a. B-25-H Mitchell has 8 forward firing .50 machine guns as well as 75mm cannon.
 - b. Newest glider is CG-15A built by Waco. Carries 16 men and can be towed at 180 m.p.h. Door in front for loading.
 - c. All newest gliders have small parachute in tail which is released as glider comes in to land to reduce landing speed quickly.
 - d. B-29's now being built have two .50 machine guns in tail but no cannon as formerly. Forward top turret has four .50 machine guns.
 - e. North American has new order for \$150 million for building of C-82 Fairchild rockets.
8. Army's jet plane P-59A Airacomet undergoing extensive Arctic tests in Alaska. Engine operates on any hydro-carbon fuel. Army personnel indicate jets soon to be used in combat.
9. Lockheed Lightning now in production is P-38J, being built in great numbers. Has four .50 machine guns and one 20mm cannon in nose and six rocket holders under wings. Allison motors V-1710 develop about 1650 h.p.

10. Also, a version called P-38L which has a ceiling well over 45,000 feet and fitted with new kind of flap when diving.
11. a. Large wooden plane in which Henry Kaiser and Howard Hughes have been interested for more than 3 years said to be undergoing test flights soon.
b. Both Thunderbolt and Black Widow have 2000 h.p. P & W motors which have some kind of water injection device. Means have to carry water tank of about 30 gallons capacity.
c. American Navy and British Fleet Air Army are both using a new Grumman called the Bearcat which seems to be a new version of the Hellcat.
12. a. The Australian Government has been given license by North American to build Mustangs in Australia.
b. Newest version of Thunderbolt, P-47N, carries 10 five-inch rockets and two 500 lbs. bombs, and eight .50 machine guns. Range more than 1000 miles, speed over 450 m.p.h. P & W engine R-2800C, four-blade Curtiss propeller. Has larger wings than earlier. Thunderbolts and the wing tips are square.
c. Trans-Continental and Western Airlines have announced they will begin regular 12-hour flights from Washington to London for A.T.C. about June. They will use C-69 Constellations and carry military personnel and equipment to England and act as hospitals in bringing wounded men back.
13. At an informal party, the Philippine General Romulo was heard to state that delay in defeating the enemy in the Philippines has kept a large number of U.S. forces engaged longer than anticipated and prevented their use in other contemplated assaults.
14. Reports seeing soldiers wearing the following shoulder patches:
 1. A blue circle with a yellow dog (or lion) in center;
 2. A black circle with a blue helmet in the center.He will try to identify the units.
15. Public incensed by press items and photographs of mass executions. Army has released motion pictures for public display. Press items say continuance of executions will carry great weight in decisions at San Francisco. Congressional committee investigating at invitation of Eisenhower.
16. Reports Willow Run now operating only one 40-hour a week shift.
17. Food situation now worst of war. Rationing of all meats. Butcher shops open only 4 days per week. Black market may result in law holding buyer also guilty.
18. (APD) Enright arrived San Diego 26 April from Canal Zone with about 12 Navy passengers and sailed on 28th with 160 Naval personnel. A British CVE, the Ranees, arrived San Diego 26 April with 30 Naval personnel and tied up at Naval repair base, undergoing minor repairs. Naval transport Admiral C. F. Hughes, sailed 14 April after loading 5,000 Marines. APA Bland loaded 1,500 Marines and sailed on 17 April. APA Fergus loaded 750 Marines and sailed 17 April.
19. CVE Sitzoh Bay arrived San Diego 30 April with 100 officers and men from Squadron 87 which has been fighting in the Pacific, also about

200 other Naval and Marine personnel. Tied up at Naval repair base for overhaul. APD Balknap arrived from Pearl Harbor 23 April and tied up at Naval repair base for overhaul. Also on 23 April APD Weber arrived from Canal Zone with about 200 Marines, Navy and Army personnel. Tied up at repair base. Big celebration on 23 April when AP Samuel Chase arrived from Guam and Pearl Harbor with about 100 stretcher cases. They unloaded about 1100 Marines from 2nd Battalion, 21st Marines, 3rd Marine Division, who had been fighting on Iwo Jima.

20. Heavy cruiser Louisville left repair base San Diego 26 April, and two submarines left there on 26 and 27 April respectively. The Manila Bay, CVE, has been at repair base since 17 February and after complete overhaul sailed on 28 April.
21. Secretary Forrestal revealed following figures giving present size of fleet: 23 battleships, 26 combat aircraft carriers, 65 escort carriers, 67 cruisers, 386 destroyers, 368 destroyer escorts and 240 submarines.
22. "Coral Sea," renamed "Franklin D. Roosevelt" and launched 29 April. Shipbuilding now become second largest industry in U.S. Now approximately 500 building ways in 70 shipyards along both coasts. Employ 1,400,000 men and women.
23. Blank reports he is leaving for sea duty on board the U.S.S. Cape Gloucester, an aircraft carrier, and will probably sail about 23 May.

21 April to 27 April 1945, inclusive.

1. 28 cylinder motor, air cooled, using gasoline, reported as developing 4000 to 5000 h.p. Another 42 cylinder motor, water cooled, developing about 7500 h.p. Have heard there is experimentation with the use of gas turbine engines developing more than 3000 h.p. and of lighter construction than gasoline engines.
2. Republic Plant, Farmingdale, L.I., approximately 800,000 sq. ft. and employs about 15,000. Plant at Evansville, Ind., about 650,000 sq. ft., and employs about 12,000. Test airport is adjacent to Republic plant.
3. Area of all Gru man plants about 2,500,000 sq. ft., employing 18,000. Brewster plant area about 900,000 sq. ft., with 6,500 employees. Figures on Brewster from former employee and not current.
4. Reported that various sources are complaining that soldiers sent as replacements do not have enough training. About 100,000 are sent overseas each month after 15 to 17 weeks' training. Stilwell says there is shortage of veteran instructors but will be improved soon. Staff officers get 20 weeks' training instead of regular 3 years.
5. Friend said she had heard her officer say that the extra time being used to mop up the Philippines would probably delay the next joint operation.
6. Press states redeployment from Europe to the Pacific has already begun but good official sources indicate that the change in President's will have its delaying effect and may cause further postponements in the Pacific.
7. 255,000 military airplanes have been built between the middle of 1940 and 1 January 1945. Of these, 105,000 were built during 1944.
8. The Navy procurement program for 1945 involves an allotment of fifteen billions dollars.
9. Manufacturers of fighter planes, jet propulsion, have their production lines running smoothly and production is rapidly increasing.
10. Considerable controversy in the Congress has centered around the employment of 18 year old draftees in overseas duty before they have been given, what is considered in some civilian circles, adequate training.
11. Public resentment is mounting against the Germans by reason of the horror stories being publicized respecting internment and war prisoners camps in Germany.
12. U.S.S. Dayton, new cruiser 10,000 ton class, scheduled to depart Philadelphia Navy Yard for Pacific on 25 April. Will take on large caliber ammunition. Will actually displace 13,000 tons when fully loaded. Over 600 feet long and 65 feet wide. 12 six inch guns in 4 triple gun turrets, 2 turrets forward and 2 aft. Secondary battery of 12 five-inch guns in six dual gun mounts. Also 23 forty MM guns disposed in quadruple mounts. 14 twenty MM guns in single and dual mounts. Has aircraft hangar and two catapults.
13. Mike may subscribe to Fortune and take copies with him.

14. Casualties for month February 1945 about 98,000. 100,000 replacements called for by Army.
Magazine article indicating; outmoded fighter planes constructed, found useless and disposed of by Army. Congressional inquiry may result. Article indicates Navy cutting down on warship building heavily.
15. P-58 Lockheed Lightning improved by new supercharger and hydraulic aileron booster, so that bomb load increased 50% and speed by 8%, or faster than 400 m.p.h.
16. Russia's supposed demands for international trusteeship of enemy bases, representation of Lublin Government at San Francisco and three votes for herself not expected to interfere with close cooperation to win war. It is argued that efforts to raise these questions are propaganda of the enemy and many accept this as true.
17. Opinion Roosevelt policies for prosecution of war will be unaffected. However, changes in personnel around new President will naturally cause some slack and probably result in delay in Pacific operations. Expressions from those close to White House indicate delay will not be serious or protracted.
18. Recent press announcements state that 210,000 Germans moved to Russia for work in cleaning up and rebuilding damaged areas. There are indications from some labor sources that this may meet with some opposition from organized labor after the war.
19. Range of robot bomb stated to be 175 miles, dependent on fuel load and size of warhead. Range controlled by small spinner timing device.
20. Robot bomb overall weight 5400 pounds. Warhead weight 2300 pounds. Tests reveal maximum speed 350 m.p.h. and minimum ceiling around 125 ft.
21. Robot engine weighs 325 pounds and consists of 3 tubular sections welded together, 125 inches in length. Nine full jets in gridwork at front of combustion chamber designed to spray fuel in whirling motion thus improving mixture and distribution. 60 octane gas powers engine and is fed to jet under pressure.
22. Production of robot bombs speeded up by assembly line methods. Ford makes engines and Willys-Overland, fuselage, wing sections, rudder and tail assembly. Ford has tooled on permanent basis, making Detroit robot center of U.S.
23. Naval aviation for next fiscal year to cost approximately three billion dollars. New jet planes will include torpedo planes, sea planes and fighters, produced on large scale.
24. Continental Aviation and Engineering Corporation now in limited production of new liquid cooled engine known as I-1430. Motor of 12 cylinders, 60 degree inverted V type and develops 2100 h.p. at 3400 r.p.m. Weight of only .59 pounds per h.p. claimed for engine.
25. Letter received from friend in San Francisco who says a General and his aide were in his office last week and stated that if the European War had ended January first that Okinawa landings would have been made about same time as landings on Formosa and the South China Coast.
26. The insignia referred to in my No. _____ identifies:
1. Thirty-sixth Division,
2. One hundred nineteenth Division, and
3. Tenth Light Division.

11. Little notice was taken by the press re break between Spain and Japan. Some speculation as to Portugal. War will not be materially affected.
12. The USS Oklahoma City, a new 10,000 ton cruiser, left Philadelphia Navy Yard 11 April 1945 for Pacific area. Probably intermediate stop Pearl Harbor. Main battery consists of 12 six-inch guns in 4 triple-gun turrets; secondary, 12 five-inch AA guns disposed in six twin mounts. She has 4 screws driven by geared turbines. Designed for 33 knots speed, USS Dayton actually arrived at Philadelphia from shakedown cruise on 23 March 1945.
13. Cramps shipyard delivered to Philadelphia Navy Yard on 25 March 1945 new submarine #301, USS Roncador. Has 10 twenty-one inch torpedoes, 6 in bow and 4 in stern. Carries one five-inch deck gun plus 40 MM and 20 MM machine guns on deck. Two more of this class being built by Cramp, also a 10,000 ton cruiser that will probably be launched in about a month.
14. USS Los Angeles now at Philadelphia Navy Yard, probably be commissioned in June. Of 13,000 ton class but will actually displace about 17,000 tons. 775 feet long and main battery consists of 9 eight-inch guns in 3 triple gun turrets, 2 forward and 1 aft. 12 five-inch AA guns in dual mounts. Will draw about 27 feet of water when fully loaded.
15. Goodyear Tire & Rubber Co. has developed a new cement that is flexible, waterproof and has high tensile strength. Adheres to any clean surface and capable of bonding metals, woods, rubber, fabrics or plastics.

17. High authority states that the need to stop harrassing operations of Jap aircraft from Iwo Jima and Okinawa brought on these subsidiary operations and caused the delay in the drive on the China Coast.

14 April to 20 April 1945, inclusive.

1. Information from Los Angeles that there were seen there several men from the 141st Division who had come down from Alaska in early March, and who said their outfit was being given leave and they expected to be moved before long.
2. Information from San Diego that the Elkhart with about 1000 Marines sailed from there on 3 April; the General Stewart with about 3000 Marines sailed from there on 2 April; the Crockett with about 1500 Marines sailed from there on 6 April; the CVE Mackinac loaded 100 Naval and Marine personnel and was to sail from there on 7 April; the CVE Altamaha loaded about 500 Naval personnel on 6 April and were expected to sail from there soon.
3. Ordnance has been actively working on developing tank detection devices, but exact results have not been ascertained. Fuse VT. T80E6 is for the 75 MM Howitzer, the 105 MM Howitzer, and the 90 MM AA gun. It was designed exclusively for use against those terrestrial targets normally engaged by time fire. It provides a means of obtaining a concentration of air burst at effective heights above the terrain irrespective of the time flight or distance to the target. Fuse T75E6 is for the 155 MM gun, and it is obtained from the Navy. Other information is not available at this time. The term "Positor" is not understood.
- ✓4. From summer 1940, to end 1944 U.S. produced 210,000 airplanes. During 1944 produced 23,000 bombers, 34,000 fighters and reconnaissance, 7,000 transports and 8,000 trainers. Army and Navy expect increased production in 1945 although newspapers expect Germany's surrender not later than summer. Distribution of production among Allies not readily available.
- ✓5. Navy will build following ships in 1945: 240 battleships, cruisers, destroyers, carriers; 190 light naval units; 80 minelayers and sweepers; 800 auxiliary tankers, cargo, etc.; 25,000 landing boats, 500 district boats. This is not an actual naval release of figures but an approximation of planned production.
6. At least two infantry divisions have been withdrawn from the Aleutians and are now being rehabilitated in the U.S. This is probably due to necessity for replacing units intended for the Pacific but sent to Europe as a result of the December break-through.
7. Meat in cold storage in the U.S. was at its lowest point on April first this year that it has ever been. USDA officials insist that all food surpluses held by the Army in Europe be kept there for feeding of liberated nationals. This will affect the feeding of troops in U.S. if redeployment starts in near future.
8. Jet propelled plane called "Swish" was mentioned some time ago but careful check indicates its name had no official sanction and could not identify it with any particular job.
9. Deliveries of merchant ships during March 1945 showed 103 ocean freighter of about 700,000 gross tons and 19 tankers of about 200,000 gross tons.
10. A narrow petroleum "cut" between kerosene and gasoline, as well as special lubricants, is being supplied by the Texas Co., for turbo-jet engines.

7 April to 13 April 1945, inclusive.

1. The twelve tank plants ordered to be immediately built at the time of the European breakthrough will not be completed. This does not involve a tank production cut-back, but the war progress is such that it is felt all required production can be met by present plants.
2. Blank friend reports that the Commodore from Chungking has left. He came in the office to say good-bye.
3. Blank's friend has written from San Francisco. Blank reports that his friend advises he has been quite busy making plans for an increased flow of supplies that is expected through that area.

6. General Electric is building the I-15 for the P-59-A and the FR-1. General Electric and Allison are building the I-40 for the P-80. Westinghouse and the Chevrolet Division of General Motors are building other jet units. Ford is building units for the JB-2. Experiments and improvements may result in new identifications at any time.
7. Deliveries in March this year of merchant ships include 103 ocean freighters of about 700,000 gross tons. Of these 26 were Liberty and 39 Victory ships. In addition there were 19 tankers of about 200,000 gross tons. Published was 126 ships of about 1,294,000 deadweight tons.

JOINT SECURITY CONTROL

29 March 1945

Special Section, Joint Security Control, is urgently interested in any enemy reaction to the following:

1. A new organic compound to prevent dangerous thickening of aviation oils at sub-zero temperatures as well as excessive thinning in tropical heat has been developed by Rohm and Haas Company of Philadelphia.
2. The XF-55 powered with an Allison engine mounted in the rear with a Curtiss electric three blade propeller has rudders near the wing tips and forward control surfaces.
3. A new air position indicator which gives continuous readings of latitude and longitude is being built by Bendix Aviation Corporation. It is automatic in its computations and calculations. It indicates nautical miles flown and correct compass heading of the plane.
4. 4,600 Maritime Commission ships were completed to January 1, 1945. About 1,100 are scheduled for 1945, among which are more than 500 ocean going tankers.
5. The XP-67 is being tested for flying wing theories. It is hoped it will meet the need for a long-range interception.
6. The XB-19A is being converted into a cargo carrier of more than 20 tons payload capacity. Four Allison V-3420 in line engines of 2,600 h.p. each furnish the power. It has a wing spread of 212 feet and a length of 132 feet.
7. Formerly producing B-17s the Boeing plant in Seattle is being converted into the manufacture of B-29s only.
8. Officials assert that the Lockheed P-80 has a record performance in the rate of ceiling climb and bomb and ammunition load capacity.
9. The USS Atlanta will depart the Philadelphia Navy Yard the latter part of March to join the fleet in the Pacific. The USS Drayton is expected to return to Philadelphia from its shakedown cruise about the same time. After a few weeks in Philadelphia it also will probably leave for the Pacific.

For information. The following questions and answers have been exchanged through special channels:

1. Question:

How far is Pratt and Whitney R-560 developed? Which cooling system is used? Has serial production of R-4630 started and which planes are equipped with it?

Answer:

Believe Pratt and Whitney R-560 to be error. Cannot locate and believe no such small engine being developed. Remainder of message evidently relates to R-4630 a few of which have been made and are being tested in various Army and Navy aircraft. Will follow this for developments.

2. Question:

As reported herein 19 March 1945 the question was asked as to what kind of apparatus was on the decks of five V-1 ships in New York Harbor early in January. We replied we were unable to identify the V-1 ships. We were then informed that the term "V-1" is a designation used by the Maritime Service and a V-1 craft is one under 65 feet in length and is used as a harbor tug.

Answer:

Have been unable to identify the V-1 ships or the apparatus. Elapsed time adds to the difficulty. Am continuing efforts.

3. Question:

Please try to ascertain what armaments the CVB's have and also size and speed.

Answer:

Am working on the armament, size and speed of the CVB's. Nothing to report yet. This information seems carefully guarded.

4. Question:

As reported herein 9 March 1945 the question was asked "Is Mosquito built by Cutting?" We answered "Cutting" was not clear. They responded: "Cutting should be Curtiss. Details about Lockheed F-58. Result of coal dust experiments for jet propelled airplanes." We had previously advised Mosquito is not built in the U.S.

Answer:

The information contained in my two four eight regarding Mosquito has been rechecked and appears correct. Informed Lockheed P-58 has been closely guarded but able to learn it is a two-place heavy-duty fighter with two Allison V-3430 engines of 2,600 h.p. each. Armament: four .50 machine guns and two 20mm cannon forward with four .50 flexible rearward. Am working on results of coal dust experiments for jet propelled airplanes but no information at present.

5. Question:

Are Navy planes made by Ryan? Output? Which planes are equipped with 36 and 42 cylinder motors from Wright?

Answer:

Ryan is making a jet plane (FR-1) for the Navy. Am trying to obtain specifications and output. There are no 36 and 42 cylinder Wright motors now ready.

28 March 1945

1. Ryan is making a jet plane (FR-1) for the Navy.
2. New aircraft carrier, Valley Forge, now in early stages of construction at Philadelphia Navy Yard. It is of the Essex class and will carry approximately 80 planes.
3. Cruiser Bremerton nearing completion and will be delivered to Philadelphia Navy Yard for acceptance in about six weeks. Description given.

It may be decided by the U.S. High Command that prior to China Coast-Formosa operations it will be necessary to take and man other covering air fields in the Ryukyus.

1. The A-6 Bomber Trainer is a new Army Air Force device for training bomber crews. It makes use of the Norden bombsight, a strip of motion picture film and a mirror. By its use the bombardier is enabled to simulate almost any combat situation.
2. Thirty new fleet carriers are planned for 1945. They will require 3,000 combat planes.
3. The Fort Worth plant of Consolidated has discontinued production of the B-24 and is now building the B-32.
4. The Army is greatly increasing its expenditures for rockets. As against \$1,000,000 for rockets in 1942 they expect to spend \$12,000,000 per month in 1945.
5. Plans for building several thousand fully tracked amphibian cargo carriers has been announced by Ford Motor Company.
6. Navy needs for torpedoes of the type manufactured in the Alexandria Naval Torpedo Station has been met and workers at that station are being released to other war jobs.

MEMORANDUM

1. Question:

Please find out the details about armament aiming equipment of General Electric used in B-29 and P-61.

Answer:

On the B-29 there are five computers that are connected electrically to sighting stations and turrets. These automatically apply correction and totalize lead, windage, gravity and parallax. One, two or three turrets may be controlled by single sighter. Forward and after sighting stations for single turret are on the P-61. Automatic comparisons kept by servos on sight and turret. Amplidyne Motor Generator has current applied by servo amplifier and operates turret drive motor.

2. Question:

What airplanes are equipped with 6.25 inch MGs?

Answer:

(MGs probably refers to machine guns). Please check and repeat the question. What does MGs mean?

3. Question:

When and with what results are imitated V-1's flown?

Answer:

Wasch reported that fairly satisfactory results were obtained in test flights begun in November at Eglin Field, Florida, on the imitated V-1. It is now in production and a number were accepted during January.

Urgently interested in any reaction to the following:

1. WPB friend states that Curtis built 150 C-46D airplanes at Buffalo in January and Douglas built 200 C-47B planes at Oklahoma City and 100 B-17G's at Long Beach during January. Positive could obtain additional information if had money to pay for it.
2. Arrival in Washington in early March of high State official and command Army official from Far Eastern Theatre for conference with command officials from Pacific areas on details of next move in Japanese war.
3. Heavy expenditures being made by Navy for rockets. Liquid oxygen and frozen alcohol is claimed by experts to be the best fuel, however, cordite powder developed by the British is in production at Sunflower Ordnance Works in Kansas and Badger Ordnance Works in Wisconsin.
4. The Air Position Indicator, manufactured by Bendix Aviation Corporation, is being used by carrier based planes to get back to the carrier without use of radios after an air strike.
5. The "Flying Box Car" C-82 'Packet' built by Fairchild Engine and Aircraft Corporation has two P and W 2100 H.P. engines forward end of each boom, wing span 106 feet, range about 3500 miles. Rear loading and used for carrying heavy artillery, machinery, tanks, etc.
6. Present plans indicate the early launching of CVB "CORAL SEA" and of CVB "MIDWAY".
7. A total of over 700,000 gross tons of ocean freighters, including 40 Victory and 32 Liberty Ships, and nineteen tankers totalling about 200,000 gross tons, were delivered during January.
8. Increased need for transportation of gasoline by air resulted in the conversion of several B-24's, C-109's and C-108's.
9. Twin rotor helicopters manufactured by Platt-Le Page and designated XE1 have been accepted by the Army.

Question:

Please find out details about transport airplane C-109.

Answer:

Blank states that modified B-24's which are used to transport gasoline are called C-109. When a B-17 is modified for the same purpose it is called C-108.

Urgently interested in any reaction to the following:

1. Thirteen percent more B dash twenty nines were produced in January than during December, according to press release by King of W.P.B.
2. Reliable source states best of equipment for convenience and welfare of staff was sent to Marianas for Admiral Nimitz's new headquarters.
3. Press continues to state a steady forward movement in redeployment of military forces but concedes it is not as rapid as at time of breakthrough on Western Front in December.
4. For the next six weeks sizeable movements will take place to and from Alaska and the Aleutians.
5. Navy reconnaissance planes and fighters totaled nearly one-half of the December production of 6,536 airplanes, according to published statement.
6. The new Lockheed P dash eight naught secret fighter is jet propelled and has been named the shooting star.
7. Increased production from converted automobile plants is forecast for immediate future since disruptions occasioned by December breakthrough in Europe have been remedied. Particular effort is being made on production of P dash eight naught and P dash forty seven dash X.
8. Fasch informed by friend that assault operation North of Saipan will begin prior to March first, as this is felt to be necessary to the protection of Admiral Nimitz's right flank before he begins his drive to the China Coast.
9. Rep reports production of over two hundred B dash twenty nine bombers during January. Reduction in B dash twenty six mediums is reported; however, production of medium bombers and their movement from factories is steady. Large numbers of planes are moving West.
10. Blank's friend at the end of January observed the cruisers, Augusta and Chicago, the heavy cruisers Los Angeles and Philadelphia, the aircraft carrier Antietam and the floating drydock San Marra in the Philadelphia Navy Yard.
11. Friend states that returning officials from Big Three conference will find high command officers from the Pacific awaiting them in Washington. Conferences as to details of firm plans will then be held.

26 January 1945

MEMORANDUM

1. Question:

To what extent are V-1 and V-2 being built in U.S. according to model? Have successful tests flights been carried out?

Answer:

V-1 bombs are built and called JB-2. Eglin Proving Ground scene of tests which are continuing after successful test flights. Japanese may be recipients of first bombs which are now being continuously produced. Trying to obtain information on V-2.

2. Question:

Of interest details B-36 and B-42. Measurements, armament, performance, bombs, where tested, and what companies build.

Answer:

B-42 is advanced design Douglas manufactured medium bomber. Consolidated builds the new long-range six engine B-36. Blank will try and get further details.

Urgently interested in any reaction to following:

1. There has been no publicity recently about landing of Japanese balloons. Blank's friend says there may have been official action taken.
2. Antietam, Essex type carrier, will be in battle service soon.
3. New battle cruiser, Guam, has completed her trials and soon goes to sea. She is 820 ft. long, has 12 inch guns and is 20,000 ton.
4. There was a 10,000 ton cruiser in the Navy Yard but could not find out whether for repair or on account of battle damage.
5. In tracing cause for General LeMay's transfer discovered that the 20th BoCom is moving out of China.
6. The difficult Army supply situation resulting from Rundstedt's December Belgium drive is now to the Air Forces spreading.
7. Unable to learn exactly 20th BoCom's new location but indications are that new bases will be placed in Philippines or Southeast India.
8. Continuing to try and locate new bases for 20th but meanwhile have found that another compelling reason for move was need for heavier strikes at South China Coast and Indo China. Also reported that from Southeast India cheaper strikes could be made against North Burma.
9. Prospective food production in the U.S. can be at a high rate in 1945 in spite of increasing manpower demands by War Production and military services. There was heavy farm machinery production during last quarter of forty four. Farm technique improvements such as "Faulknerizing" and "Rotofilling" are also being widely used.
10. There was surprise at the light air opposition to carrier airplanes blows at Canton and Hongkong. The possibility of a South China Coast landing to help assault on Formosa by Nimitz is being discussed.
11. Press statement that ships will be given to France by U.S. and G.B. is confirmed officially.
12. WMC critical material list indicates some further curtailment in "essential" civilian supplies.
13. On December 28 all outstanding prior-to-December food ration coupons were cancelled. Press said move was not from shortage but to make counterfeit coupons unusable.
14. WFB head stated in press that 250,000 new workers will be required for 1945, scheduled war production.

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15. Press stated draft calls will increase from the sixty thousand for December to a rate that will produce 900,000 in the first half of the year.
16. Army casualties collected in Washington through 29 December were published as 564,000.
17. Wing tank in P-47-N causes a new range of more than 1800 miles. R-2800-C, P.& W. engine develops from 2000 to 2500 H.P.

(1) Question:

How many P dash seventy sixes were produced and when did the production stop?

Answer:

Blank reports no knowledge of a P dash seventy six. P dash seventy fives have been reported but the airplane is not in production and may never be in production. Less than a dozen P dash seventy fives were produced during all of last year.

(2) Question:

To what extent are V-1 and V-2 being built in United States according to model? Have successful test flights been carried out?

Answer:

Being prepared. Will be reported in next issue.

Urgently interested in any reaction to the following:

- (1) Statement made in press that sixty thousand were drafted in December and that January calls will be one hundred and ten thousand. Calls for first six months nineteen forty five indicated at nine hundred thousand. WPA states industry needs two hundred and fifty thousand new workers plus replacement.
- (2) Press reports that War Department has announced total Army casualties through December twenty nine as five hundred and sixty four thousand.
- (3) Army took control of Electric Illuminating Co., Cleveland, Ohio, sixteen hours after work stoppage began. Forty or more war plants in that part of Ohio were forced to curtail production during strike.

MEMORANDUM

(1) Question:

Describe the number and the art of the insignia that you see. Also find out the higher commanders' names and ranks. Also if you can ascertain the dates of shipping out.

Answer:

"Blank" says that he frequently finds out the names of leading commanders of camps in this area from "pick up" friends but that he is not permitted to go anywhere near embarkation point. Embarkation docks are patrolled heavily and quite distant from Navy Yard. He is able, however, to find out about transfer of Navy men and officers from and to shore station and ships.

(2) Question:

How are troop dispositions published. Reports of employment of troops and movements of troops to transport very important. Verify and state source.

Answer:

Information mentioned was first release of troops in France and was an official War Department release and published in Washington Post on November twenty eight. There were no further releases. Dave friend stated that public relations officer who OK'd release was sent to troops about December first. Will continue to try to get this type of information.

(3) Question:

Can you confirm whether the Mosquito is built by Curtiss?

Answer:

WPB source indicates that Curtiss is not building "Mosquito" nor is any other U.S. company.

(4) Question:

Can you confirm whether Douglas in Tulsa is building B-32 or B-29?

Answer:

WPB source states that Douglas builds only medium size airplanes not super heavy bombers in Tulsa.

Urgently interested in any reaction to the following:

- (1) Fifty percent absences from work during week between Christmas reported by press. In an effort to reduce this loss of work time, Chairman Krug of KPB stated that American shortages in ammunition and supplies aided German advance into Belgium.
- (2) On December twenty eight Washington newspapers published totals of five hundred and forty eight thousand Army casualties to date.
- (3) Blank learned that one of his sailor friends had been sent to West Coast to be a member of crew detail for U.S.S. Tennessee which was in a West Coast port the latter part of December.
- (4) Friend said that supply officials think the expected Mid-January assault against Formosa has been postponed for several weeks. He said that the equipment, men and supplies were ready for the assault but that the ability to follow up the assault with further supplies was lacking on account of heavy emergency European demands.
- (5) Request has gone to State Department to delay certain plans that they were to put into effect after Formosa was taken near end of January. Postponement probably caused by European situation.
- (6) Wave's boss left suddenly for San Francisco on January six to attend conference in Admiral Ingersoll's office caused by emergency changes in Pacific plans.

(1) Question:

Please give details about fifteen to seventeen knot Victory Ships.

Answer:

Victory Ship details as follows: three decks to Liberty Ships' two decks, length 455 ft; beam 62 feet. CT 9046. DWT 10800 engine H.P. six thousand plus. Speed above 15 knots.

(2) Question:

Is the Griffon motor manufactured in the United States?

Answer:

Consideration given to manufacture of subject motor at Packard but project has been dropped as far as can be learned.

(3) Question:

Please find out about fabrication of V dash one in USA as mentioned in papers.

Answer:

Assembly at Wright field, Ohio. ATSC has five laboratories working on project. Machine fabrication solved but propulsion material problems not yet solved.

(4) Question:

Please find out details of B-30 and Horsefly.

Answer:

B-30 is a Lockheed four-engine VHB brought out in design competition with B-32 and B-29. No production as yet as far as can learn. Could "Horsefly" be "Hoverfly" which has been proposed as a name for one type of helicopter.

(5) Question:

- (a) How many pilots in training?
- (b) What are the upper and lower age limits?

Answer:

(a) More than 30,000 are in training as of December 1944 but program will be reduced after Navy's early 1945 operations are concluded.

(5) Answer: (Cont'd).

(b) Top age limit of 25 years and bottom age limit of 18 years apparently will remain in view of the B-29 bombing results that are expected after there are proper bases on Formosa and the China Coast.

(6) Question:

How many U.S. carriers?

Answer:

Of all types there are more than eighty U.S. carriers assigned to different task groups but all under the command of Nimitz.

(7) Question:

- (a) How many carriers in 1945?
- (b) How many carriers in 1946?

Answer:

(a) Plans for 1945 indicate that there will be about one hundred carriers for use in obtaining air fields close enough to reduce Japan while China is being rehabilitated.

(b) Present plans call for a 1946 increase of about twenty five per cent over 1945 for various theater area operations after Allies are firmly established in the rear of Japan.

(8) Question:

What is the largest size tank built and how many are being produced per month?

Answer:

57 ton is the largest U.S. tank but more 42 ton M dash 26 tanks are being made. Production of these is somewhat less than 300 per month.

(9) Question:

Monthly production of B-24s and B-29s.

Answer:

Compilation of available figures indicate B-24 production of app. 500 per month and at least 150 B-29s but B-29 production is being rapidly increased.

Urgently interested in any reaction to the following:

- (1) On December second at the Navy Yard I saw the light cruiser Brooklyn which arrived from Europe for overhaul. She had received no battle damage.
- (2) Early move of Admiral Nimitz's headquarters to Guam has been made possible by the new supply arrangement under Admiral Ingersoll in San Francisco. Pacific operations may be speeded up considerably if the good San Francisco Admiral does not make his changes too fast.
- (3) B-29 production one five four in November with prospects of the increased production providing larger groups for Tokyo strikes when Navy reaches Coast of China.

12/4/41

Urgently interested in any reaction to the following:

- (1) Blank does not know how soon he may be transferred. Large increase in movement of enlisted men to ships and to West Coast from his Navy Yard.
- (2) At Army-Navy game were large group of Chinese Naval Officers, who are going to command Chinese ships after additional instruction at U.S. Naval Academy.
- (3) Two Naval officers talking in N.Y. bar said that a lot of their friends were going to San Francisco and that maybe their old boss would soon ask for them.
- (4) Blank's friend tells him that the first principal phase of their photo job directed towards Japan, China and Formosa has now been completed.
- (5) Friend also trying to find real cause for Ford Motor Co.'s first three day shut down since war started.

- (11) Many high officials are surprised by the tough fight the Japs are putting up in Leyte.
- (12) The former Eastern Sea frontier commander who was believed by Admiral Jonas Ingram is putting together a first-class logistics organization in the West.

(13) At the Army-Navy club a high Naval officer was overheard, saying:
We may not hit them by the Pearl Harbor anniversary but I'll

- (1) Question: Exact details about production of pursuit airplanes, transport airplanes and cargo gliders in September.

Answer: Blank states that Sept. production of pursuit airplanes was one six five five, including P-38, P-47 and P-51. Cargo glider production was almost 300.

- (2) Question: Details of production of jet airplanes.

Answer: P-59 Airacometes that were produced by Bell Aircraft, Buffalo, are now used as jet fighter trainers. Blank is trying to obtain details of other experimental models including Lockheed XP dash fifty eight.

Urgently interested in any reaction to the following:

- (1) H.B. From about November 30, 1944 please watch for any reference to document containing details of instrument to overcome disadvantages of attack from "planes coming out of the sun" - Madrid.
- (2) Friend hard to date most evenings because she has extra work brought on by strong Japanese resistance in Philippines. She says she also has extra work because Navy ideas relative Japanese campaign are gaining ground.
- (3) It is reported that the B-29 production will be doubled in three months.
- (4) His friend in the War Department about whom I have spoken says that he is much surprised by the tough fight the Japs are putting up in Leyte.

No questions received.

Group II.

- (1) Navy Department has been asked to find if copies of Aziatskaia Rossia are available.
- (2) Planes for escort may be equipped with twenty four cylinder motors, Allison type and range up to fifteen hundred miles.
- (3) Concern has been caused by escape of two German prisoners of war who remained at large from July until November, 1944, twice crossing the U.S.-Canadian border during that time.
- (4) Between one and two thousand copies of V-1 bombs have been ordered by WD for experimental purposes. If controllability can be improved they may be used in war against Japan.
- (5) Ships as large as Essex type carriers, badly damaged in Pacific battles have returned all the way to U.S. Navy Yards, been repaired and returned to action.
- (6) Blank reports that BB Missouri, Iowa class that had docked at ship yards in Bayonne, N.J. has cleared probably for sea.

3 November 1944

MEMORANDUM FOR:

Group I.

- (1) Question: "Can friend give information regarding output of airplanes and motors last month according to type and manufacturing plant especially combat transports and cargo planes?"

Answer: Obtained from my friend, Roberts, the following: Curtiss built one hundred and eight one, two engine transports; Douglas built three hundred and twenty three, two engine and forty nine, four engine combat and cargo transports during September. Beech built over one hundred, two engine light transports. Studebaker built twenty four hundred Wright, R dash one eight two zero, nine cylinder motors; Buick and Chevrolet together built over five thousand P. & W., R dash one eight three zero, fourteen cylinder motors; and Ford, Nash and P. & W., Hartford, built approximately four thousand P. & W., R dash two eight zero zero motors.

- (2) Question: "Is the mosquito being built in the USA?"

Answer: The mosquito is not built in the USA. Roberts thinks that it is made in Canada.

- (3) Question: "Where is the new Grumman factory in Ohio exactly situated? How many workers? What kind of airplanes are produced?"

Answer: Have no knowledge of a Grumman plant in Ohio. Main operation is at Bethpage, Long Island. Subsidiary plants are in New Jersey.

Group II.

- (1) An Essex type carrier that was damaged in a battle that took place before the recent Philippines action came all the way to the West Coast for repairs and is now back in the Western Pacific.
- (2) Air officers consider Mustang top fighter plane. Supercharged engine develops over 1500 H.P.; speed 425 M.P.H.; range near 2000 miles. Ceiling approximately 40,000 ft. Carries 50 caliber machine guns and heavy bomb load.

- (3) Air Forces, experiment with rockets for reducing plane take off distances, have been very successful.
- (4) October issue of National Geographic carries a story of the independent colonization of the Bonins by American citizens in the last century. This story has caused considerable speculation in fashionable circles.
- (5) I may be able to get release on certain details of the secret weapon used on Saipan and against fortress strong points in Europe.
- (6) A close election is indicated. Outcome will depend on Massachusetts, New York and Pennsylvania. Informed source states Pennsylvania will go Republican. If Republicans win, Japanese war tempo will increase.
- (7) A second motor that develops three thousand horse power is the Allison V dash three four two zero.

MEMORANDUM FOR:

Group I.

- (1) Question: "Details regarding Pratt and Whitney desired?"

Answer: Pratt and Whitney, twenty eight cylinder motors, R-4360, are in limited production only. Cylinders are in four banks of seven each. Some articles have been delivered to the Navy for tests with several experimental aircraft. A few have been delivered to the Army for the same purpose.

- (2) Question: "(Are) export restrictions to Soviet Russia known?"

Answer: As far as can learn there are no export restrictions on shipments to Soviet Russia. Records unavailable for a complete check against their last offer list. There was mention of unfilled orders for trucks and certain types of chemicals about two months ago.

- (3) Question: "What kind of transport airplanes are built by Glenn Martin, Baltimore?"

Answer: Glenn Martin plant near Baltimore builds two engine PBM dash three Navy patrol bombers that are used for high priority cargo and four engine Mars planes reported as JRM dash one also for Navy Transport use.

- (4) Question: "Our interest only in relation to aircraft construction. What is known about Boeing B-327?"

Answer: Details B dash thirty two closely guarded. However, comprehensive training program is being set up at field in South. Production at Fort Worth and San Diego going forward slowly but parts and supply channels are being set up in preparation for the heavier production soon to come.

- (5) Question: "Of great interest is output of landing boats."

Answer: Impossible to get exact figures of production but production of LSM's is being increased more than 100% while large numbers of LST's are being built. Large numbers of LCM(6), LCVP and LVT(4) are in production. 1400,000 officers and men required to man landing craft during next six months.

- (6) Question: "(Of great interest is) armament and performance of P dash sixty one."

Answer: P dash sixty one has 50 cal machine guns mounted in two or four gun remote controlled top turret and twenty MM cannon under belly. Speed over three hundred and fifty miles per hour.

- (7) Question: "(Of great interest is) B dash thirty two measurements and bomb load capacity."

Answer: B-32 wing span 135 feet, length 83 feet, speed, range and bomb load comparable to B-29. Cabins not pressurized.

- (8) Question: "(Of great interest is) new landing equipment."

Answer: LSM, landing ship medium, which combines best features of LST, LCI(L) and LCT(6); larger LCS with much greater rocket capacity; LVT(3), LVT(4), LVT(A)(4), all improved "Alligator" and "Water Buffalo" types, and LCR(L), larger rubber landing craft, are the newer types now being built.

- (9) Question: "(Of great interest is) infra-red seeker type bombs."

Answer: No answer sent.

- (10) Question: "Do you have chance to report on movements of ships out of Boston, Phil., and Halifax?"

Answer: Do not have the opportunity of getting reports as port areas are closely guarded. Should I try and arrange contacts at U.S. ports? Halifax more difficult.

- (11) Question: "Where does Chrysler build fuselages for B-29?"

Answer: Chrysler builds main sub-assemblies, not complete fuselages, at De Soto plant, Detroit, Mich.

- (12) Question: "Who develops P-75 and in which factory is it built? when tested? Since when is serial production?"

Answer: General Motors, Cleveland, Ohio, builds P-75. Test flown early 1944. Several of these planes have been built but do not believe it is in full production.

- (13) Question: "Which motors of more than 3000 HP are in development or being built?"

Answer: P-4W., R-4360, develops 3000 HP and Allison V-3420 develops almost 3000 HP.

Group II.

- (1) Submarine program is keeping up to schedule. Submarines Quillback and Argonaut were launched at Portsmouth Navy Yard on the same day that the submarine Capitaine was launched at Groton, Conn.
- (2) Madame Chiang Kai-Shek, who is ill in hospital in New York, has not been told of the death of her good friend, Wendell Willkie.
- (3) Aviation pilot's training course has been lengthened due to fewer combat losses than planned for. Replacement pool of trained pilots is full to overflowing.
- (4) Radio commentator stated there was a rumor current in Washington that Joseph Stalin would visit Washington in December.
- (5) There are no export restrictions on material for lend lease to Russia altho there were such restrictions earlier in the war.
- (6) Cleveland Ohio aviation plants that formerly built fighter plane parts will start production on parts for B dash twenty nine.
- (7) Navy is now building three or more large carriers displacing forty five thousand tons. These carriers are about nine hundred feet long and will be able to carry eighty medium bombers while having speed, fire power and defensive armor sufficient to remain engaged in any type of fleet action.
- (8) The Navy's building program for medium carriers is advancing rapidly. At Brooklyn Navy Yard alone, two Essex type carriers are speedily approaching completion.
- (9) The P dash sixty one has twenty ME cannon mounted under its belly and two or four gun remote controlled top turrets containing fifty caliber machine guns. Its speed is over three hundred and fifty miles per hour.
- (10) More landing ships and landing craft are now being produced monthly than ever before. Most emphasis is being placed on LSM's, landing ship medium, which combines the best features of the LST, LCI(L) and LCT(6). However, considerable numbers of a larger LCS type with a much greater rocket capacity are now being constructed.
- (11) A military helicopter training school has just been organized at Freeman Field, Indiana. A new model helicopter recently flew a distance of seven hundred and twenty five miles.
- (12) Seven thousand five hundred and ninety eight planes including a record number of B-29's were produced during the month of September.

- (13) The success of our submarine and aircraft bombing campaign against Japanese shipping has been so great that the production program of torpedoes for U.S. submarines has been cut back materially.
- (14) Various subdivisions of General Motors at Detroit are producing quantities of heavy gun ammunition. Olds and Pontiac produce as much as one hundred thousand round, each, of one zero five MM and one five five MM ammunition per month.
- (15) The U.S. battleships and cruisers used in the channel landings and the Mediterranean landings are now being completely modernized in East Coast Navy yards in preparation for the coming China Sea offensive.
- (16) The B dash thirty two does not have pressurized cabins. Otherwise, its speed, range and bomb load is comparable to the B-29.

27 October 1944

28 March to 6 June 1944, inclusive.

1. The "Valley Forge," a new aircraft carrier of the Essex class, is now under construction at the Philadelphia Navy Yard.
2. Information that the "Mosquito" airplane was built in Canada and not by Curtiss in the U.S. has been rechecked and appears correct. Information about the Lockheed P-58 has been closely guarded, however, have found out it is a two-place heavy-duty fighter. It has two Allison V-3420 engines of 2600 h.p. each. Equipped with four .50 machine guns and two .20 mm cannons forward with four .50 flexible rearward.
3. The "Bremerton," new armored cruiser, is due for acceptance by the Navy at an early date. Engine trials have been held.
4. The Sunset loaded about 250 Naval personnel at North Island and sailed on 20 March. The Carlisle sailed from San Diego on 17 March after loading about 775 Marines. On the same date the Crittenden sailed from San Diego with about 550 Marines. New aircraft carrier Shangri-La sailed from North Island on 7 February, loaded with 500 and 1000 pound bombs.
5. Some Navy flying boats are using a new take-off apparatus called the "jeto."
6. A Ryan jet propelled plane has been observed at the Naval Air Station, San Diego. It has remarkable climbing ability and a reported speed of over 600 mph.
7. Around New York area some anti-aircraft batteries and many Air Corps ground units are being broken up and trained as infantry replacements. Some of these men have already been sent to France.
8. The light cruiser, "Houston," has arrived at the Brooklyn Navy Yard for repairs and overhauling.
9. The "Midway," CVB launched at Newport News, Va., on 20 March will be commanded by Capt. J. F. Bolger. The Midway is heavily armored and will carry over 80 twin-engined planes. It will have a crew of 3000 officers and men.
10. B-29's are produced at Wichita, Omaha, Atlanta, and Seattle. Two of these plants produce 135 planes per month with schedules calling for a 300% increase this year. Boeing has received contracts for the building of 1700 additional B-29's during the present year.
11. Robot bombs similar to V-1's are being assembled at Willys-Overland Auto Works, Toledo. Ford Motor Company is making the propulsion units.
12. The jet motor of General Motors is designated the I-16 and I-40.
13. Electric Auto Lite Company at Toledo, Ohio, is now making a new type control unit for Army tank radio communications, that will eliminate interference and increase range and reception.
14. Hobart Bros. Co. at Troy, Ohio, are manufacturing a five KW transmitter and receiver unit light enough to be dropped by parachute for troops or stranded patrols.

Implementation by Special Means

For Week Beginning 27 August 1945.

1. At the request of the Chinese the Foreign Economic Administration has prepared a preliminary outline for the future industrialization of China. General in scope, it concentrates on improving transportation, diversifying agriculture, building of small and efficient industries and developing resources.
2. Japanese-Americans who, during the war, have been excluded from the area of the Western Defense Command will be permitted to return to their former residences under the terms of a new order to be issued soon after the proclamation of V-J Day.
3. The U.S. Navy will insist upon unrestricted control of Pacific bases considered by the High Command as necessary to future national defense. There is some opposition to the U.S. establishing extensive chains of defenses at remote overseas points, however, public opinion apparently backs Navy policy in this regard.
4. During the past five years U.S. industry has produced 300,000 combat planes; 3,600,000 trucks; 1,000,000 tanks; 87,500 warships, including landing craft, and 5200 merchant vessels; 45 billion rounds of ammunition; 450 million tons of steel; 35 billion yards of cotton textiles for war use; all of which has been used for the war effort and without seriously disrupting domestic economy.
5. U.S. rubber plants are prepared to immediately convert to peacetime manufacture of automobile tires and car users are promised an adequate supply of new tires by January.
6. Pro-Japanese circles in the United States have been proposing well-known Japanese as acceptable for the accomplishment of United States objectives. Among these have been named Terauchi, Homma, Nomura, Oshima and Kurushu. Other circles are very skeptical of the sincerity of such personages, and in a recent discussion in the office of one of the officials of the State Department, it was pointed out that Terauchi was a member of the Black Dragon Society and that Homma, although originally believed to be pro-Western is now believed to be a violent Anglophobe.
7. General MacArthur was recently instructed by the President that the formal signing of the surrender terms should be an open news event and that unhampered reporting of the event would be encouraged.
8. 617 German merchant seamen, who were formerly members of crews of German vessels and who have been interned in the United States, some since December of 1939, will shortly be returned to Germany.

9. The French government has requested that the ships GLOIRE and FANTASQUE join the East Indies Fleet as soon as possible in order to
- B. participate in the surrender of Japanese forces in Indo-China.
- The French government has also asked that French air and ground forces previously intended for use in the Far East be shipped by the first available means to India in order to participate in the re-occupation of Indo-China as soon as possible.
10. The corps Leger D'Intervention is immediately available for this operation. It is also proposed that the Fifth DIC and the First DIC
- B. be trans-shipped immediately. The last two units are reported to have an effective strength in excess of forty thousand men.
- The French government also desires to send immediately two transport squadrons and a tactical air command.
11. Both the United States and the British governments are continuing research in rockets and rocket development. The services of German
- B. personnel experienced in rocket development, production, and use are being employed by both governments.
12. A force of eight American submarines have been operating in the Sea of Japan and are officially credited with sinking over 100,000 tons of
- A. shipping. The ships were the CHEVALIER, BOWFIN, TUNNY, FLYING FISH, TIGER, SKATE, SPALFISH, and SEA DOG. They were known to the Navy as the Hellcats, and were grouped in three sections: the Kryptos, Bobcats and Polecats. Their mission is described as one of the "most dangerous deeds of the war."
13. Planes of the Third Fleet were almost within striking distance of the Tokyo area when they received word that Japan had surrendered. They
- A. jettisoned their bombs and returned to their carriers.
14. The British battleship ANSON and several new light carriers have
- A. joined the British Pacific Fleet.
15. Allied recipients of lend-lease are to have these privileges sharply curtailed. Lend-lease will be continued to Allied Nations cooperating
- A. in the redeployment of U.S. military forces only. U.S. peace time credit structures, private capital and trade organizations are pushing plans for financing post-war business.
16. MacArthur will be furnished minimum forces of 1,500,000 men for his
- A. forces of occupation.
17. The United States occupation authorities will hold the Japanese authorities strictly accountable for any untoward incidents occurring
- A. during the occupation. Official circles fear the possibility that the Japanese government may be hiding soldiers and war materiel prior to occupation, and do not overlook the possibility of Japanese treachery. In spite of newspaper comments, good authority states that MacArthur will be furnished a minimum of 1,500,000 men for occupation forces.

18. A new Swedish-Polish trade agreement was reached in Warsaw on 20 August. Through this agreement Sweden will receive four million A. tons of coal and 600,000 tons of coke, as well as other raw materials, and will ship to Poland iron ore, wood pulp, ballbearings, and machinery in exchange. It is believed that the present agreement will continue to 1 December 1946.
19. Reconversion of industry from war to peace is proceeding well in the United States. The United States Government feels that the A. successful transition of American industry from war to peace is essential to the success of the transition efforts of other nations.
20. It has been learned that Britain will re-arm the Egyptian and Iraqi armies with British equipment from the Middle East, while retaining A. for their own use American equipment provided on lend-lease.
21. Yugoslav military personnel now in the United States-British area of Venetia-Giulia are receiving rations, forage, gasoline, and other supplies from stores of the British forces in that area. It has been learned that one-half of the cost of those issues is being defrayed by the United States Government. Some resentment has been expressed in official quarters on the fact that the United States receives no credit for this act but that the benefits all accrue to the British.
22. It has been learned that captured or surrendered enemy war material required for the maintenance of minimum civilian economy will be A. sold to German civilians in Germany. These items will include horses, road transport vehicles, parts, tires, fuels, lubricants; and are to be employed in producing and moving essential commodities.
23. Netherlands East Indies Forces, operating under the Supreme Allied Commander of Southeast Asia, will not receive United States supplies A. and equipment, but will become exclusively a British responsibility.
24. Approximately thirty-five billions of dollars represents the net balance due the United States as a result of the extension of C. credit under lend-lease. There is a growing demand in Congress that negotiations for the settlement of lend-lease accounts be commenced immediately so that fixed responsibility can be determined and all interested nations can adjust their financing accordingly. This Congressional element desires there be no post-war aftermath comparable to that attending the Mellon debt settlements following World War I. They insist that the huge credit fund established by the U.S. for post-war financing be used as a means for promptly clearing up lend-lease.
25. The occupation forces in Germany are disarming all German fishing craft that had been requisitioned for Navy purposes and returning O. them to their pre-war ports of origin. This will help increase the food supply for Germans.
26. Two German destroyers have arrived at the Navy Yard in Boston where O. they will be used for study and test purposes.

27. The Air Forces had scheduled a heavy increase in B-29 and B-32 operations against North China, Korea and all the Japanese home islands during the remainder of 1945.
28. Plans for American Army Transport Service between Paris, Geneva, and Marocelles have recently been completed. Participation by the Army Transport Service in air transportation between France and Switzerland is causing strong objections on the part of the French government, who feel that such service competes with Air France who is operating planes on this route. The French-Swiss Line is the first of the French commercial air services to be inaugurated since the end of the war in Europe. Pending the establishment of a formal agreement on commercial air service with the United States, the French have been on their guard against expansion of non-military United States services in France.
29. United States commercial air competition is feared and is resented strongly by most of the governments of Europe. The British government has formally requested the Portuguese government not to enter into any bilateral contracts until the British have explained their views. It is believed that similar situations exist in Sweden, Switzerland, and South Africa.
30. With the end of the war against Japan, the French, Dutch, and Portuguese are coming forward with urgent military problems regarding the occupation of their various liberated territories in the Southwest Pacific and Southeast Asia. The British Chiefs of Staff have proposed to the American Chiefs of Staff that they handle in London the French, Dutch, and Portuguese matters directly.

Implementation by Special Means for Week Beginning 3 September 1945.

1. The pre-war form of naval government will be continued at Guam, and will be extended to include Saipan, Tinian, Rota, and other islands B. of the Marianas.
2. When Japan formally surrenders, all Allied naval ships, with the exception of United States ships, previously under the command of B. the Commander of Naval Forces of the Southwest Pacific, will come under British Empire Control.
3. Tetra-ethyl lead is now being made available to civilian use in the U.S. A stockpile of over 60,000,000 pounds of this item is known B. to have been reached at the end of hostilities with Japan.
4. The Navy has discontinued harbor entrance control posts at thirteen B. Atlantic ports.
5. Rubber is expected to be available from Borneo in a few weeks. Intelligence information indicates that destruction of rubber trees B. has been negligible and that natives possess huge tonnages of rubber that they have kept hidden away in Borneo and other areas.
6. A new trade treaty between the U.S. and China is about ready to submit to the two countries for ratification. Its provisions will B. include arrangements for long-term loans to China.
7. The Netherlands Government is anxious to complete the training in the U.S. of a Netherlands Marine Brigade, and, since this can no longer be done under lend-lease, are prepared to pay the expenses B. of such training.
They desire to get this outfit in combat condition as soon as possible as they desire to use it against such local pockets of organized Japanese resistance as may remain in the Netherlands East Indies.
8. The postponement of the Bulgarian elections has been received with satisfaction in American official circles and is considered as further B. evidence of agreement between the U.S., Great Britain and Russia.
9. Reports from Japan that freedom of speech, press and assembly will conform to the spirit of the Peace Preservation Police Law of 1925 A. are not well received in the U.S. since it is known that this Act has long been used to stifle true liberal and democratic movements in Japan.
10. In the reconstruction of Berlin former Nazi party members are being assigned menial tasks in the compulsory labor service while preference is being given to those whose religious and political ideas caused them to lose their jobs under the Nazis.
11. In spite of official statements to the contrary, lend-lease to China A. will be continued in effect for some time.
12. The Navy Group China, organized as the Sino-American Cooperative Association (SACO) had effected complete surveys of the coast of

- A. China from the South China Coast to Shanghai by the Spring of 1945. Considerable survey work was underway between the Shanghai area north to the Shantung Peninsula by the time of the Japanese surrender. These surveys were undertaken in addition to their normal activities, such as coast watching, collecting and transmitting weather information, air pilot rescue service and guerilla warfare.
13. The Navy is halting the construction of 56 combatant vessels and 39 auxiliaries. Scheduled work on 160 district craft and auxiliaries
A. will not begin.
14. The Navy has been obtaining suitable bunker fuel oil in commercial quantities from Tarakan for the past several weeks.
A.
15. The British maintained a naval base in New York City during the war, designated HMS SAMER. It was established for the repair of heavy ships and new construction. The work was done at the Brooklyn Navy Yard and adjacent smaller yards. The battleship MALAYA and the cruisers PENELOPE, PHOEBE and ten others, 20 corvettes and a large number of destroyers were repaired there. Since March 1941, 15,000 officers and 150,000 men passed through there for temporary duty or assignment.
A.
16. Over 2,500 heavy bombers of the B-17 and B-24 types are in excess of military requirements for the security of the U.S. and its possessions.
C. The disposition of these ships is presently being considered.
17. Approximately 80,000 Russians were repatriated from northwestern Europe by the end of July this year. Most were shipped by sea from C. Sweden on Russian and Finnish ships.
18. The British government desires that Ocean and Nauru Islands be surrendered to Australian Commanders. Nauru falls within the jurisdiction of Australia and Ocean Island is part of the Gilbert and Ellice Islands colony and falls within jurisdiction of U.K. High Commissioners for the western Pacific.
C.
19. Maritime officials will support legislative proposals in Congress seeking to establish national policy regarding the disposal of the vast merchant fleet, that has been built during the war.
C.
20. Guam and the adjacent islands of the Marianas Group will constitute the keystone of the proposed naval system for the future control of the Western Pacific. The pre-war form of naval government, administering normal government functions, will be continued on Guam and will also be applied to such other Pacific islands taken from the Japanese and placed under U.S. control for strategic reasons. This will not include the Philippines.

21. Plans are now in progress to divert a number of C-4 Victory Ships from cargo runs to the Pacific to bring troops from Europe to The U.S.
C.
22. A strong resistance movement had been organized in Thailand and British and American authorities had much difficulty in persuading the leaders against taking overt action against the Japanese. Such action would have interfered with Allied operational plans.

The moving up of Nimitz's Supreme H.Q. to Guam was decided upon in accordance with the establishment of Admiral Ingersoll's new position.

This will have a great effect on Pacific strategy and it may well be that the resourceful Americans who work swiftly and on a large scale have some typical scheme up their sleeves.

I. Production of B-29's in November, though on the surface showing a considerable rise, actually dropped to 154 planes because of defective planes. However, as production of this type of plane will probably show a continuing increase, it appears that after the invasion of the Chinese coast, and the occupation of bases according to the established plans of the American fleet, large-scale air attacks will be carried out against the Japanese mainland and Tokyo.

Wasch reports his friend has learned that the resolution to transfer Admiral Nimitz's headquarters to Guam was influenced principally by the fact that Admiral Ingersoll provided new supply routes from his headquarters in San Francisco.

The friend assumes that by these means, Pacific operations will be strongly accelerated in case that no attempt is made to change too much in too great a haste, which is the American custom.

Wasch reports the B-29 production in November amounts to 154, and a few additional planes were manufactured but were not accepted. Wasch gives the further information that his friend informed him that the authoritative government departments are highly satisfied with the prospect of increased production, since according to their opinion, essentially heavier formations can be used in the attacks on Tokyo after the carrying out of a planned invasion on the China coast by the USA fleet.

According to the estimates of U.S. military commentators, a large-scale attack against Formosa in the middle part of January was expected but had to be postponed several weeks because of supply difficulties. An attack against Formosa demands enormous quantities of men and equipment and the ships to transport them, but at the same time there is a pressing need to send supplies to the European front. As a result there have been difficulties in the settling of the European and Far Eastern supply problems.

Last evening Wasch's friend reported that Army supply personnel believe that today's European West Front situation caused perhaps a few weeks' delay of the expected middle January large attack on Formosa. Although ships, military forces and materials for this attack are available, there is serious doubt over their capability of sending constantly increasing masses of war materials to the Central Pacific regions, because even now, many important necessary demands in Western Europe have precedence.

1. A high Navy authority states that the United States Navy has on hand about 40,000 landing craft of all types, with more than 15,000 additional authorized and being built. (Para 9)*

2. During 1944 the United States produced 96,359 airplanes (including 16,048 heavy bombers), 30,899 ships, 17,565 tanks, 595,330 army trucks, 3,284 heavy field guns and howitzers, 7,454 light field guns, 152,000 army aircraft rocket launchers, 215,177 bazookas and 1,146,774 tons of ground artillery ammunition. (Para 10)*

A 7 AUGUST 1945 MESSAGE FROM THE JAPANESE

NAVAL ATTACHE IN SWITZERLAND TO TOKYO

Japanese Message Text

1. According to the opinion of an American officer, anti-aircraft installations in the Arni area are adequate against attacks by parachute and glider forces.

2. The greater part of the heavy bombers used by the United States in Europe are now being remodeled for sending to the Far East.

3. A large amount of construction materials and military stores are being shipped to north Pacific areas via Seattle from Pittsburgh, Detroit and Chicago areas.

4. Repairs have been completed on the new United States aircraft carrier INTREPID and it has been recommissioned. This ship had been damaged four times in the past 15 months. It destroyed 660 attack planes (and 189 uncertain), and sunk 75 enemy ships (in addition to 35 uncertain). Although 3 Japanese special attack planes went through the deck of this ship, it was saved from explosion and sinking.

Joint Security Control Text

1. In a recent conference held in Washington in which anti-aircraft defenses on the China Coast were discussed, a staff officer of COMINAVOP CHINA stated that the anti-aircraft defenses at Kemoi are inadequate to prevent a major airborne operation. (Para 8)*

2. An Army Air Force officer states that a high percentage of the heavy bombers being returned to the United States from Europe will be rebuilt and put in new condition before any of them are sent to the Pacific. Many of them will be used as replacements for training purposes. (Para 11)

3. A War Production official states that during the next few weeks sizeable shipments of heavy equipment and construction materials will be made out of the Pittsburgh, Detroit and Chicago areas destined for Seattle and trans-shipment to the North Pacific. (Para 12)*

4. A Naval officer states that the Navy has authorized and will soon award decorations to 29 officers and enlisted men who have served aboard the Essex Class carrier USS INTREPID since it was commissioned in August 1943. This ship is now back with the Pacific fleet after receiving repairs for battle damage for the fourth time in fifteen months. She is officially credited with destroying 660 enemy aircraft and probable damage to 189 more, and with sinking 75 enemy ships and probably 35 more. Thirty suicide pilots have crashed on her decks. (Para 13)*

5. The warship GUAM has been assigned to the Far Eastern Fleet and has participated in the attacks on the Ryukyus, Shikoku and the Inland Sea.

5. The USS GUAM, the new battle cruiser that joined the Pacific fleet this year, participated in the recent action against Shikoku. This ship first saw battle action last March during the air assault against the Ryukyus and the Inland Sea where she supported a withering defense against suicide dive bombers' attacks on carrier units. She is reported as most effective in island assault and in rendering carrier support and has been extensively used in both. (Para 14)*

NOTE: The Japanese Naval Attache in Switzerland prefaced the above items with a remark that they were from American sources and would seem to be "highly reliable".

Week Beginning 20 August 1945.

1. As of August 11, 1945, the U. S. Navy ordered construction stopped on a large number of naval vessels, including carriers, cruisers, destroyers, submarines and a battleship. Remaining under construction after this order were one battleship of 45,000 tons, 22 cruisers in various stages of construction totalling about 200,000 tons, 74 destroyers totalling about 160,000 tons. Most of those vessels can be completed this year but indications are that work will be slowed up and spread out so as to keep certain shipyards in active operation. Since the reduction of August 11, the Navy has authorized the cancellation of contracts in large amounts. These later cancellations will also affect other stoppages in combat ship construction, but to what extent is not definitely known at present.
2. Movements of troops from U. S. to the Pacific are temporarily suspended. However, no permanent orders have been issued and all machinery is held at the alert so that movements may be resumed immediately if deemed necessary.
3. The drastic cut-backs on contracts for war supplies, materials and equipment do not include any of the contracts that affect the production of the atomic bomb.
4. The President is expected to issue a new executive order declaring a new state of emergency exists. This is for the purpose of providing authority for the exercise of control over certain domestic situations, particularly labor. Due to the acceptance by Japan of the Potsdam Declaration and the cessation of War and War Time powers, no specific labor control legislation is in effect unless a new executive order is issued.

5. Japanese claims concerning the relative ineffectiveness of the atom bomb are known to be propaganda,
B. particularly in view of conflicting reports which come from Japan.
6. Many high United States government officials personally fear possible treachery in connection with the Japanese surrender. An atmosphere of watchful waiting permeates all high official quarters.
7. The current surrender negotiations being directed by General MacArthur are being watched with close interest throughout America. The general American attitude is one of distrust and suspicion of the Japanese.
8. In spite of interests of other nations in Asia and in the Far East, and because of American primary responsibility in the war against Japan, America will insist upon the deciding voice on all problems arising in the Far East in which she has an interest.
9. The recent 3-day carrier attack in the East China Sea along the coast southeast of Shanghai, was carried out A. by a task force under the command of Vice Admiral Olendorf. This attack was the beginning of an operation planned to take this task force on raids further up in the Yellow Sea.
10. The U. S. Navy and the Soviet Pacific Fleet have agreed on operating arrangements for convoys in the Okhotsk Sea A. whereby the U. S. Navy assumes responsibility for convoying Soviet Vessels in certain areas. Maintaining lines of communication will be the responsibility of both fleets. Supplementary escort strength will be furnished by the Soviets.
11. The War Shipping Administration is beginning to deliver

- to transport duty a part of the Victory and Liberty
- A. ships that were ordered to be converted into troop carriers.
12. The Navy's amphibious base at Falmouth, Cornwall, England, has been turned back to the British.
- A. Amphibious equipment has been returned to the United States.
13. Considerable resentfulness is felt among the American general public because of Japanese inability efficiently to control elements of their armed forces following the Japanese surrender.
14. Although several influential sources are urging the United States to ban the use of the atomic bomb, it
- A. has been stated on good authority that this weapon will be retained, developed, and refined as one of the guarantees of future peace.
15. It is generally believed in Washington that the American Congress will shortly reconvene in order more
- A. closely to supervise a just but firm peace with Japan.
16. Plans are underway to begin flying supplies to China from Luxon so as to relieve some of the pressure on
- C. the hard-working planes crossing the hump. With the increased number of transport planes now available it is felt this will speed up operations and be a tremendous aid to General Wedemeyer in transporting needed supplies until sea communications can be established.
17. In the event Japanese forces continue resistance in China after the capitulation of the Japanese home government, U. S. Forces will proceed with the plans for a
- C. China campaign, providing any forces necessary, in

cooperation with its allies, for a successful termination of the war in China.

18. Naval Air Forces had been given the task of quickly disrupting transportation facilities in Korea and C. completely breaking up shipping from Korea to the Japanese Islands.
19. Prevailing bad weather during the last week in July prevented large scale anti-shipping operations that C. were scheduled for Kyushu and Inland Sea Areas as well as East China and the Yellow Seas.
20. The present Ceausescu Government in Rumania is known to be enjoying close working relationships with the Soviet C. occupation regime.
21. An American officer recently returned from Berlin estimates that the average German is getting a little more than a thousand calories a day. He further stated that Berlin is going through the worst food shortage it has experienced in over 20 years. The Soviets had previously announced a ration scale ranging from 2700 calories a day for heavy workers to 1500 a day for children.
22. It is rumored that the present Rumanian government may not be recognized as a democratic type of government under C. the Potsdam Declaration.
