In addition to the specific information and intelligence entered herein and obtained by analysis of radio addresses and traffic as well as breakdown of codes and analysis of the results which was subsequently disseminated to the parties concerned and interested, this unit supplied general enemy intelligence by conference, to task-force and submarine commanders, prior to departure. This unit also produced and disseminated daily, such intelligence as:

New calls and changes in calls of enemy parties, units and vessels.

Identification of calls and addresses.

Estimated location and strength of enemy land and sea forces.

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Estimation of projected movements and campaigns.

Bearings and positions of enemy vessels and units by D/F.

Translations of enemy dispatches containing estimated positions, D/F fixes and sightings of our forces.

interested and concerned, including forces at sea, whether so indicated or not.

All information and messages are paraphrased from the originals.

During September - October 1941, it was ascertained that the CINC SECOND FLEET was organizing a task force comprising units approximately as follows below:

The COMBINED AIRFORCE is assembled at TAKAO with indications that some components have been transferred to HAINAN.

It is believed that THIRD FLEET UNITS are moving toward TAKAO.

There is also believed to be concentrated in the MARSHALLS:

AIRRON TWENTY FOUR

1 CARDIV (at least)

1/3 of the submarine fleet (probably)

Intelligence was received from the British Consul that from a usually reliable source, it is learned that the Japanese, in order to establish positions between Kankok and SINGAPORE, will attack the KRAKOW ISTHMUS from the sea on 1st December. It is believed they will proceed direct from HAINAN and FORMOSA and will make the main landing at SONGKHLA and there will be no ultimatum or declaration of war:

December 7

Attack on PEARL HARBOR, general quarters.

MIDWAY being bombed.

6-TENA

1047, HEETA obtained bearings on COMCARDIV THREE AND continued taking bearings on JAPANESE transmissions.

1250, continued taking bearings on 4302 Kc., 6 units on this circuit with YOKOHAMA AIR controlling. These units are believed to be: YOKOHAMA AIR SAIPAN AIR SEVENTEENTH AIRCORPS KAMOI AIRCORPS 6-RASA

December 8

SAIPAN is broadcasting traffic on 4870 Kc. to HIKU-8, FOURTH FLEET CofS, and COMMANDER SAIPAN AIRFORCE.

GUAM reported all codes destroyed.

December 9

0400, HEEIA on 7151 getting mostly 2-KANA CALLS and handling 4-character NIGORI, code.

2135, JAPANESE RADIO reported HMS REPULSE and HMS PRINCE OF WALES torpedoed and sunk off DAVAO, P.I.


December 10

0430, NAVY YARD airraid alarm sounded.

CIPHER (effective 4th Dec. 1941-27th May 1942. First recoveries made about this time.

December 11

Secretary of the Navy, FRANK KNOX, in company with Admiral BLOCH visited the office.





December 12

1130, DT being set up navy operators are operating under Army orders.

December 14

JAPANESE have set up an airbase in the GILBERTS, with YOKOHAMA AIR set up there.

2100, Cable Company reports MIDWAY air raid alarm sounded.

December 17

Message intercepted on 7730 Kc. in plain JAPANESE.

"Today at 1100 hours 50 minutes, a number of enemy ships 115 miles from KAMONO CAPE bearing 225, (TARUMI) from MUNU"

December 18

December 20

Reported preliminary investigation on Agents system

December 27

1200, JALUIT is the communication center for all submarines operating in the MANDATES and the EASTERN PACIFIC.

JALUIT sorvice call and the Submarine calling and transmitting procedure sent to interested parties.

December 28

2020, WAILUPE reported that PALAO is broad-casting to COMBINED FLEET ON 6385 Kc. Investigating and checking this revealed it to be HIYO, a SUBDIV commander operating between HAWAII and the West Coast of the U.S.





New system in effect 1st January.

1818, the calls for shore stations have changed.

HONI New call for SAIPAN
NIKA New call for TOKYO
MUTU New call for THAILAND RADIO (believed)

The main weather cipher table now 95% complete and we are reading 80% of all JAPANESE weather traffic.

January 29

1210, it is indicated that 2 ships left DAVAO at 1230 17th January transporting 18 planes of one type and 9 of a second type for CARDIV TWO.

February 4

There are indications that the MA CAMPAIGN FORCE is directed toward JAVA.

February 10

0030, sent the following to interested parties:


"On 12th February, 5 unidentified ships will sail in a convoy from YOKOSUKA for TRUK via CHICHIJIMA and SAIPAN 1 or more will go on to KWAJALIEN and they will be escorted as far as CHICHIJIMA".

February 12

CARDIV THREE (Less HOSHO) is to depart 15th February for Davao.

February 18

Informed parties that as from 12th February the external characteristics of the the system were changed

February 22

Disseminated information regarding area designators and other plans in ALEUTIANS.

February 26

Disseminated information that a convoy will leave KURE at 0700 today passing through points (K) (B) (S) (F) and will arrive at DAVAO on 3rd or 4th March. Speed is 13 kts. Passengers include 950 ARMY personnel and 30 for the weather station. Cargo includes Base gear, bombs, communication outfit.

February 28

0130, intercepted and disseminated:

COMCARDIV THREE message to THIRD FLEET - RYUJO position today at 0800 is 07-00 N, -10-00E, course 173, speed 20.

March 1

New Orange weather code in effect, however few stations using it, probably as distribution is not yet complete and this office still reading majority of Orange weather. Indications Wake occupied with construction activities. CRUDIV SEVEN, DESRONS TWO, FOUR AND FIVE IN CELEBES-JAVA area. SHOKAKU and ZUIKAKU in YOKOSUKA area.

March 2

The Commander of an AIR GROUP in the MARSHALLS has directed a subordinate to transfer seventeen planes (probably 4-engined bombers) from one base to another base in the MARSHALLS on 3 March and until a pending offensive operation has been completed. Indications civil engineering units in MARSHALLS engaged in replacement work and also in new construction.

March 3

Indications that at least five JAPANESE SUBMAR-INES will commonce operations in INDIAN OCEAN shortly, and will probably base at PENANG. AIRRON TWENTY TWO, CRUDIV SEVEN, DESRON FIVE, KAMIGAWA MARU (XCV) active in JAVA area. CARDIV ONE and TWO plus RYUJO in JAVA-CELEBES area

CINCPAC informed orally that an air attack may be expected as COFS SIXTH FLEET, COFS COMBINED FLEET, COFS SUBFORCE, COMSOUTHSEAS—AIR AND YOKOHAMA AIR were sent force and direction of wind in OAHU and 2 other areas from TOKYO.

March 5

T.I. shows evidence that a SUB is at or in vicinity of FRENCH FRIGATE SHOALS and suggests the possibility of refueling operations for flying boats.

March 6

JAPANESE making every effort to locate U.S. FORCE at MARCUS ISLAND on 4th, so far this force has not been located. Apparently some portions of installations ashore at MARCUS are not usable.

March 7 Indications intensified patrols and searches both air and surface noted in Marshalls area, and extending as far as the MARIANAS. CINC FIFTH FLEET in command of forces in vicinity MARCUS ISLAND and his title is probably COMMANDER NORTHERN FORCE.

March 8

Strong indications that submarine base or group will be established in NEW BRITAIN area. There are indications that JAPANESE have occupied SALAMOA and LAE. Enemy forces included 4 DESTROYERS or CRUISERS. It is believed KAMOI sighted an ALLIED ship or plane at 0200/ZED/7. It is probable that submarines will base on New Britain in near future.

March 9

It is evident that there is construction activity at Rabaul. It is probable that both ships of Carrier Division Five will proceed to the CELEBES. It is indicated that an AIRCRAFT TENDER is proceeding in a northerly direction from 32N, 149E.





It is indicated that the JAPANESE have sighted a U.S. force consisting of one carrier, two cruisers and five destroyers at 0135/Z/10 in the NEW BRITAIN AREA.

It is evident that the movement of aircraft from SOUTHERN EMPIRE to YOKOSUKA AREA continues.

March 11

It is indicated that JAPANESE forces in the JAVA-CELEBES Area include CARRIER DIVISION TWO, and CRUISER DIVISIONS FOUR, FIVE and SEVEN.

CRUISER DIVISION SIX LOCATED in TRUK-NEW BRITAIN area.

March 12

Everything points to a concentration in CHICHIJIMA AREA of CARRIER DIVISION FIVE, part or all of CRUISER DIVISION FOUR, at least several BATTLE-SHIPS and many units of FIRST FLEET.

March 13

Surface and air searches and patrols are being conducted from bases in JAPAN and SAIPAN-CHICHI-JIMA area in an effort to locate an ALLIED FORCE believed to be north of WAKE on March 10. It appears that results of the searches are negative to date, but every effort will be made to locate and attack this force using all available aircraft.

An air base has been established at POKAAKU (TAONGI ATOLL) in the MARSHALLS.

March 14

Noted first mention of RYUKAKU as a carrier.

There are indications that part of CRUISER DIVISION FIVE and DESTROYER SQUADRON FOUR will return to the KURE - SASEBO area.

March 15

Disseminated the information that CARDIV FIVE (less 1 unit) but plus PLANE GUARDS will arrive YOKOSUKA on the 16th and depart on the 17th to arrive STARING BAY March 24th.

New ORANGE weather cipher system of in effect today, however as many stations are still using the Maru and Patrol Boat ciphers, about 30% of the weather is still being read.

Enemy convoys enroute TRUK - NEW BRITAIN areas are using STEFFEN STRAIT (NORTHWEST NEW IRELAND) as rendezvous.

March 17

To interested parties: Position of the KAGA at 0800, 17th, 05-06N, 128-00E; Course 020. speed 16.

At 0032, A MALAY FORCE COMMANDER said: "This force will leave LINGAYAN on the 17th and will proceed to YOKOSUKA arriving there on the 25th, via TAKAO and SASEBO".

March 18

It is indicated that air searches from WAKE, MARSHALLS and MAKIN extend to 600 miles and some air searches from the EMPIRE extend to 700 miles.

There is no indication of an immediate major offensive action except in the MALAY area.

March 19

There are increasing indications of offensive operations from the MALAY PENINSULA

March 20

The derivation of the new (system was discovered today and approximately half of all weather traffic can now be read.

During the past few days the majority of the weather stations were using system which resulted in a decrease in weather reading to about 25%.

CARDIV FIVE is enroute KENDARI.

March 21

There is no information regarding the large invasion force in vicinity of AUSTRALIA although AKAGI, CARDIVS T//O and FIVE plus part of BATDIV THREE are in the general CELEBES area.

There are indications that some of the aircraft now enroute to the MARSHALL are destined for WARE

Informed interested parties: From an unidentified call: "MIZUHO will leave DAVAO 1200, 22nd for YOKOSUKA, arriving there in the morning of the 28th." SECRET

There are indications of an increase in movement of aircraft to the MANDATES from JAPAN in the near future.

March 23

It is indicated that the KAMIGAWA MARU (Seaplane tender) is enroute to the EMPIRE.

There is continued concern over activities of the ALLIED submarines in EMPIRE waters resulting in increased air patrols.

March 24

There are indications that AlDAMAN ISLAND has been occupied.

There is one JAPANESE SUBMARINE returning from the West Coast of the U.S. and is now to the Westward of OAHU.

March 25

There are continued indications of offensive action by the JAPANESE in the INDIAN OCEAN area. The CINC SECOND FLEET is in immediate command of the forces in this area. The forces in this area will be augmented by cruisers and destroyers.

March 26

The AKAGI, CARDIVS TWO and FIVE in CELEBES area. the RYUJO is operating in the MAIAY area. The KAGA is at SASEBO.

March 27

A seaplane base is being established at PORT BLAIR , in the ANDAMANS, there are also indications that SUBMARINES may be expected in that area.

March 28

The ENERY may be expected to base surface craft in the ANDAMANS as well as submarines and seaplanes. Air searches are now conducted from that place.

Repair and refitting of units of FOURTH FLEET now at or enroute to bases is being expedited.

There are indications that the AKAGI may be in TRUK area shortly.

It is indicated that the BIHORO AIR, GENZAN AIR, AIRRON ELEVEN and TWO SUBRONS are now conducting patrols from PENANG and ANDAMAN Islands.

March 30

At 0734 G.C.T. the () will sail from ENIWETOK on the 30th for YOKOSUKA, and will rendezvous at 24-00N, 150-00E on the 5th of April.

Except for normal air patrols and searches the EAST INDIES areas are quiet.

There are strong indications of enemy advance into the NORTHWEST NEW GUINEA shortly.

March 31

The TAICHU AIR GROUP may be expected in the MARSHALLS - NEW BRITAIN area shortly.

There are strong indications that the forces in the MALAY area have commenced a new offensive movement. The units involved are SUBRONS TWO and FIVE, shore based air in MALAY and SECOND FLEET units including part of CRUDIV FIVE, SEVEN and DESRON FOUR.

April 1

Air strength in the NEW BRITAIN area expected to be greatly strenghened in the immediate future.

The forces in the MALAY area are being augmented by SECOND FLEET units, and there is increased air activity from MALAY into the INDIAN OCEAN indications.

April 2

The air forces in the NEW BRITAIN area have been reorganized and additional aircraft will be supplied from the MARSHALLS and PHILIPPINES.

The MARSHALLS air forces are likewise being reorganized with the command probably at JALUIT.

The RYUKAKU will be in the MARSHALLS soon.

Occupation of NORTHWEST NEW GUINEA continues and there are indications that the enemy may be expected in the area from SORONG to HOLLANDIA shortly.

There is also an indication of consolidation of gains in the NEW BRITAIN area and further advance into the SOLOLIONS.

April 4

Traffic shows that the Commander of the MARSHALLS AREA AIR FORCE is now at KWAJALEIN in connection with the reorganization of the air forces in this area.

One SEAPLANETENDER or CONVERTED CARRIER is indicated enroute from RABAUL to JAPAN.

April 5

Indications that supply vessels are being routed between RABAUL and TRUK.

Forces in the MALAY AREA include part of CARRIER DIVISION THREE, CRUISER DIVISION SEVEN, DESTROYER SQUADRON THREE, SUBMARINE SQUADRONS TWO and FIVE plus SHORE BASED AIR SQUADRONS operating from the MALAY PENINSULA.

April 6

Indications that CARRIER previously reported enroute from RABAUL to JAPAN is now approaching YOKOSUKA and that there are possibly two other vessels engaged in FERRYING AIRCRAFT and aircraft supplies to the MARSHALLS - NEW BRITAIN area.

April 7

Indications that two AUXILIARY AIRCRAFT CARRIERS are now enroute from the MANDATES to JAPAN.

April 8

The first mention of the R.Z.P. campaign was observed today.

The KENJO MARU transporting TAIMAN AIR EQUIPMENT and KIYOZUMI MARU (SEAPIANE TERDER) are protecto RABAUL.

April 9

There are strong indications that CARRIER DIVISION FIVE plus SORYU are in the BAY OF BENGAL.

There are indications that the period of reorganization and replenishment of supplies is ending with a consequent increase of JAPANESE operations expected.

April 10

The GOSHU MARU (AIRCRAFT TEMDER) is indicated at MALOELAP.

HOSHO and TWO CONVERTED CARRIERS ferrying aircraft to NEW BRITAIN and MARSHALLS are now near YOKOSUKA.

April 11

The NOTORO is indicated enroute to SINGAPORE.

One or more auxiliary AIRCRAFT CARRIERS now in YOKOSUKA area expected to return to MANDATES shortly with PLANES and equipment.

April 12

Substitution table was discovered today for cipher period in effect 10th April to 1st October.

There are indications that additional planes have arrived in the AMDAMANS area.

April 13

system changed on 4th April.

Observed indications that the ZUIKAKU and SHOKAKU are engaged in the current operations.

The RYUKAKU will be used to train personnel for participation in the (SHIKI) campaign, after her return to TRUK.

Amil 14

The RYUKAKU will depart for TRUK on the 20th and should arrive there on the 25th. She has on board:

Indications that units of TAIMAN AIR CORPS are now enroute RABAUL via KENJO MARU.

April 15

0800, 16th G.C.T. It is indicated that the RYUJO plus 2 other units are on their way to KURE via (PALAU?), estimated arrival about 22nd.

Distribution of the new general weather code is apparently nearing completion as the use of and has been gradually decreasing, resulting in now reading only about 20% of all weather traffic.

April 16

0044, 17th, CARDIV THREE and CRUDIV SEVEN sailed from SINGAPORE at 1700, 15th. Expect to arrive at KURE between --- and 1800 on the 22nd.

All indications point to withdrawal of heavy FLEET UNITS from BAY OF BENGAL to JAPAN for operations to SOUTHEASTWARD in immediate future.

The RYUKAKU is expected in TRUK next week.

April 17

Two unidentified ORANGE war vessels left SINGAPORE 1200, 16th escorting a convoy of 11 ARMY vessels and intend to rendezvous with 5 more from BANKOK at a point 15 miles south of PEROKONDURO light at 1200, 19th. The convoy will arrive AMOY about the 26th, thence SHANGHAI about 28th and DAIREN on the 3rd or 4th of May. Speed is 8 kmots.

There are indications that the NEW GUINEA OCCUPA-TION FORCE has occupied SERUI ROADS (JAPEN ISLAND).





At 0630 (I) April 18, ALLIED AIRCRAFT were first reported by an ENEMY vessel.

ALLIED SURFACE CRAFT reported in vicinity of 35N, 150E. An intensive search is being conducted by all units in YOKOSUKA, CHICHIJIMA, MARIANAS, and MARSHALLS areas, including search by submarines.

April 19

Sent to interested parties the following messages:

"0630, 19th, CRUDIV FIVE (less NACHI) departing at 1100 for TRUK. Estimated arrival 24th.--- and ---- will join at 1200 20th at 24-10N, 138-40E"

"2345 19th, (RYUKAKU?) will be in a position 34-40N, 130 (140?) E at 1200 19th, speed 22 knots."

The air strength in the MARSHALLS is being concentrated in the WAKE area.

April 20

CARDIV FIVE is now proceeding to TRUK.

There are indications of lessened intensity of search for units involved in attacks on TOKYO as some enemy air and surface groups are resuming normal employment.

April 21

SECRET

It is apparent that major fleet operations in the INDIAN OCEAN have been completed and impending operations will start from the EMPIRE.

There are strong indications of an impending concentration in the TRUK area.

CINC SECOND FLEET has completed his duty in the EAST INDIES and MALAY AREA and has been given a new task.

April 22

MALAY and BAY OF BENGAL AREA activities greatly reduced with departure of HEAVY UNITS. With the exception of SHORE BASED AIR and SUBMARINES no large scale offensive action in the immediate future is expected from EAST INDIES AND MALAY AREA.



Disseminated the line-up for the SHIKI CAMPAIGN also the anchorage assignments for CARDIV FIVE at TRUK.

There are indications that the ENEMY AIR BASE at KCEPANG will be moved.

April 24

KASUGA MARU (converted carrier) is departing JAPAN shortly for the MANDATES.

Some units of forces operating in NORTHWEST NEW GUINEA are now enroute to SASEBO.

Units of GUNBOAT DIVISION EIGHT enroute TRUK from SASEBO.

April 25

RYUKAKU enroute YOKOSUKA but will return to TRUK shortly.

ATAGO is now in YOKOSUKA and expects to depart for TAKAO area soon.

April 26

There are continued indications that CARDIV FIVE and CRUDIV FIVE (less NACHI) and DESTROYERS will operate to southward of TRUK.

Air reinforcements are expected for NEW BRITAIN area in the immediate future from MARIANAS and MARSHALLS.

April 27

Operations orders of MANDATES FORCE disseminated.

Air and surface activity in Northeast JAPAN is back to normal while activity in the CAROLINES, MARSHALLS and NEW BRITAIN area is increasing.

April 28

There are indications that a BATTLESHIP unit is in the TRUK area.

Three BATTLESHIPS of BATDIV THREE are in the NAVY YARD until the middle of MAY.

April 29



The MARSHALLS Air Force is searching to 600 miles from MALOELAP and KNAJALEIN.

Evaluation of Pacific Situation:

Major operations in the INDIAN OCEAN are complete and 2 CARDIVS and CRUDIV SEVEN have returned to the PACIFIC from the BAY OF BENGAL.

There are no indications of large scale operations from JAVA, BALI or TIMOR.

Campaign now underway involves SOUTHEAST NEW GUINEA and the LCUISADES..

Interest in the ALEUTIANS has been recently shown and a raid on them is considered probable at a later date.



Informed interested parties that accurate indications of movements in and out of PEARL HARBOR were being obtained by ENEMY interception of PLANE conversations.

Orders to CRUDIV FIVE, CARDIV FIVE and FOURTH FLEET indicate objective of the "MO" CAMPAIGN will be to restrict enemy fleet movements, by means of attack on outlying units at various areas along the North Coast of AUSTRALIA.

OCEAN (BANABA OR PAANOPA) ISLAND

Was reported to lie about 3 miles farther southward than its charted position, which, for its southern extremity, is 0°53'S., 169°35'E.

The island, about 6 miles in circumference, is surrounded by a fringing reef which dries and extends out about 100 yards from the shore. Its center, about 265 feet high and nearly flat, descends fairly regularly to the coast. Cliffs from 12 to 30 feet high surround the island except in a portion of Home Bay.

The wreck of the steamer Ocean Transport lies on the edge of the reef just clear of the boat channel in Home Bay. A breakwater is being built from the wreck to the shore.

Winds

Easterly winds are predominant throughout the year.

Current

The current usually sers westward faily strongly, but from December to March it frequently sets eastward.

Caution

Vessels should not approach the island within 2 miles after dark.

Mooring buoys

There are two large mooring buoys in Home Bay for the use of large vessels.

There is a smaller mooring buoy between the two large buoys and closer inshore. It provides a much better mooring for a vessel not exceeding 265 feet in length.

Vessels moored to these buoys should be prepared to proceed to sea on short notice in the event of an unfavorable change in the weather.

There is no anchorage for large vessels at Ocean Island


