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MEMORANDUM FOR LOWELL J. PAIGE

SUBJECT: Summarizing telephone conversation with S.S. Cairns,
8 January 1953

1. Cairns informed Paige that it is now appropriate to make definite commitments for SCAMP 1953 in the cases of A. A. Albert, A. H. Clifford, D. W. Hall, M. Hall, A. E. Roberts and J. A. Ward. Of these, it is understood that Clifford, M. Hall and Roberts expect to be available for only part of the session. A commitment to A. M. Gleason need wait only until his plans are better formulated, perhaps in February.
2. It was agreed that Randolph Church, Chairman of the Mathematics Department at the U. S. Naval Postgraduate School, should be invited to participate if this can be done on a basis of paying his travel expenses and a per diem for expenses while in Los Angeles.
3. Cairns agreed to see that Albert sends in forms DD-398 and fingerprint card if he has not already done so; also to supply such forms and cards to R. H. Bruck, K. A. Bush, R. A. Good, A. J. Hoffman, E. Kleinfeld, G. Pall and W. A. Pierce. It is assumed that Commerce Department clearances have been initialed in Los Angeles for all the above, excepting those who will be employed through UCLA and Hoffman, who is already employed by the National Bureau of Standards. Paige is to supply forms DD-398 to R. P. Dilworth. (Cairns finds he wrote down some salary figures, 621 per mo and 705± during the conversation, but forgets to whom they pertained)
4. It is understood that the prospective participants will have the need for double clearances explained to them in the hope of minimizing the irritation of filling out two sets of forms.
5. A few other SCAMP matters were mentioned, which can be handled when C. B. Tompkins and Cairns visit Washington together early in February. Paige may wish to supplement this memorandum if it seems too incomplete.
